FALLS TO DEATH
FROM PRECIPICE
Brother of Bailey Millard,
Author, Killed Near San
Jose, California.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
San Jose, Cal., April 12.—Plunging
over an 80-foot precipice into Alum
Rock canyon, Hiram C. Millard, man-
ager of the Grant Mineral Springs and
brother of Bailey Millard, the author,
met a terrible death and his body was
recovered by Joe Millard, another
of his brothers. Just how the man fell
over the precipice may never be known,
but it is supposed that he was
struck by a falling log which he was
accidentally falling into the canyon.
Millard left the springs at dusk in a
wagon, accompanied by two women
daughters of mountaineers. They had
been riding for some time when Millard
left the wagon, saying that he would
catch up with them. That was the
last time he was seen alive.

HURLBURT LEADING.
Conceded Now to Be Strongest Candidate
for State Railroad Commissioner.
Since the unsuccessful attempt of one
of his opponents to label him as the can-
didate of the railroad companies has
operated as a boomerang it is generally
conceded by the political prophets here
that W. H. Hurlburt is in some

of thinking people, rather than a handi-
cap.
