"This, your honor, is another case of 'personal liberty.'"  
"I suppose so," said Judge Bronaugh, with a tone of weariness in his voice.

When the roll had been called, five women had been freed from drunken husbands and one husband from a drunken wife. The wife, Mrs. Margaret Bacon, who was once sent to jail to sober up, by Judge Gantenheim, because she appeared before him in the juvenile court in an intoxicated state, came to the courtroom to hear her husband tell the sad story of a ruined home. ## STALE BEER AT BOTTOM OF KEGS BASIS OF LUCRATIVE BUSINESS

Ingenuous minds do not need opportunities—they create them.  
Drainings from old beer kegs have been found valuable and it has remained for a Portland boy to evolve the idea of gathering the stale beer, selling it and making a comfortable living for himself and family. The stagnant beer is sold to harness dealers, who use it to color and prepare the finishing touches on their handsomest and finest sets of harness.  
After drawing the beer from the kegs in the saloons there is always a quart or two left over. This is usually because of the fact that there is sediment at the bottom of the keg. These empty kegs are of no use to the saloon men and are often put in the cellar or in the back yard of the brewery wagon drivers call for them. The Portland boy has his regular route, over which he goes daily and drains the kegs, putting the liquid in a large bucket he carries.  
The longer the stale beer stands the more it increases in value. Then it is sold to the harness dealers, who claim that beer makes a better leather polish than any other mixture in the world.

R. & N. to Spokane and thence over the Canadian line to St. Paul or the Atlantic coast.
