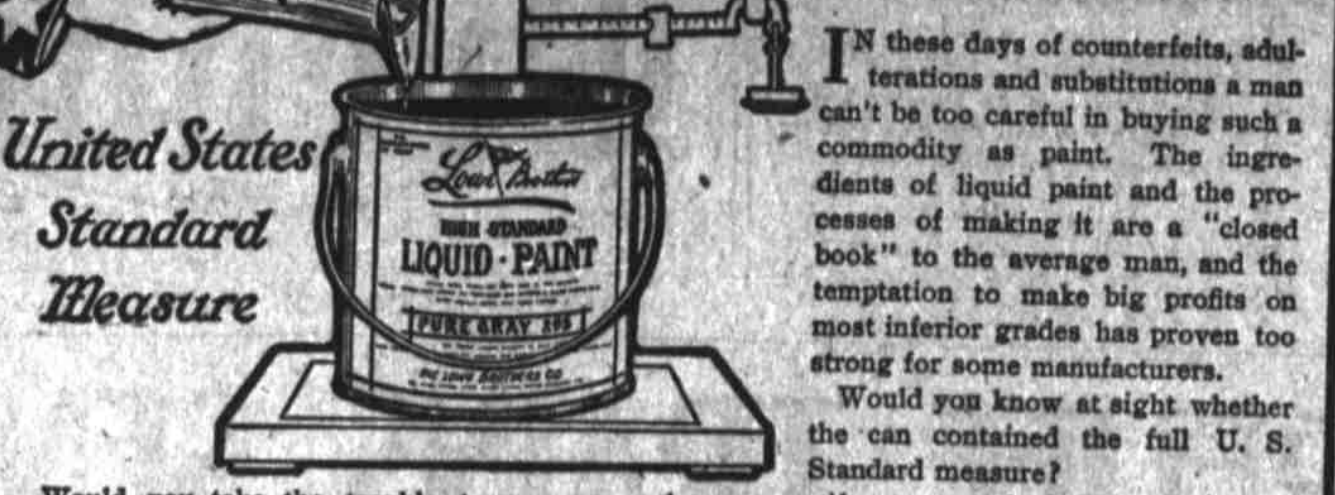
PRESBYTERY AT RIDGEFIELD, WASH.

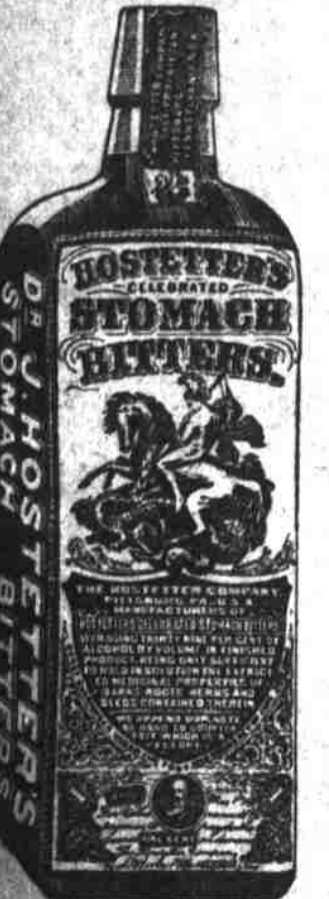
