

HERO OF MERRIMAC WILL SPEAK IN BEHALF OF NAVY



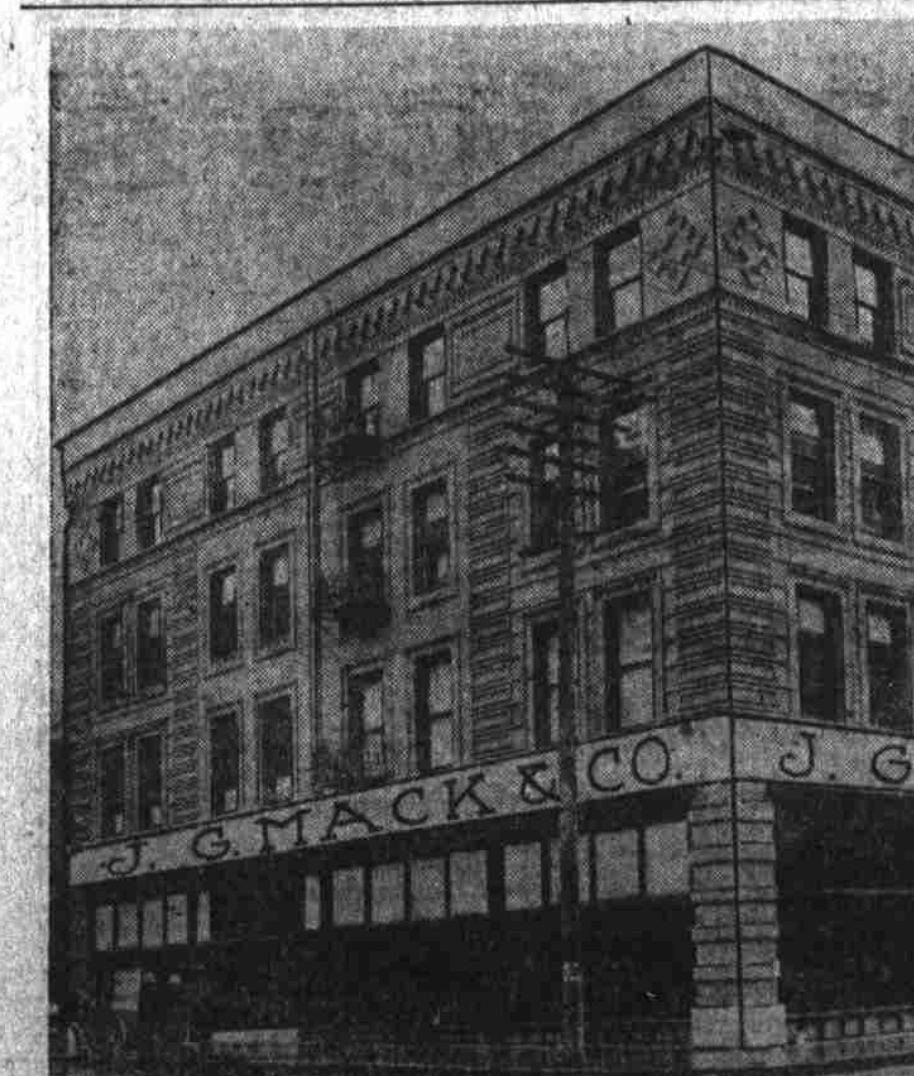
CAPTAIN RICHMOND PEARSON HOBSON

One Hundred Years Ago Today New York Catholics Established Their Cathedral Cardinals Gibbons and Logue Attend Ceremonies.

Growth of Church

One hundred years ago there were about 15,000 Catholics in New York and New Jersey. There were four or five priests, one church, the Church of St. Peter, at Barclay street, and one parochial school. The diocese, which is now the one See, has been divided into nine dioceses, and there are now about 2,500 priests.

O. A. C. FACULTY STRENGTHENED

More Students, More Room, More Instructors and More Everything.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Corvallis, Or., April 25.—At the adjourned meeting of the board of regents of the Oregon Agricultural College, held here Thursday afternoon and yesterday, the principal matter under consideration was the election of the faculty for the ensuing year. In addition, the board adopted a regulation providing for an entrance fee of \$5 amount. Provision was also made for the continuance of the interschool high school meet, the same as for last year.

School of Commerce Enlarged. The school of commerce is to be altered in its scope so as to present a course in such subjects as economics, banking, finance, production, trade, transportation and insurance.

Domestic Economy. The school of domestic science and arts has been broadened to cover all subjects taught in the departments of trade, transportation and insurance. The dean, Miss Juliet Greer, is now in charge of one of the departments of Pratt Institute of Brooklyn and is a graduate of Vassar college. She has had instruction in Columbia university and the University of Chicago, in addition to her experience as a teacher in Chicago and Cleveland.
