SAILOR COMMITS SUICIDE AT SEA

 San Francisco, April 29.—A yearning to see his sweetheart whom he had left in Europe, coupled with a feeling of helplessness, caused Andrew Olson, a

seaman on the British bark Kilmeny, to leap overboard February 9, while the ship was in the southern Atlantic. The news of the suicide was brought here by Captain Jones of the Kilmeny, which has just arrived with a cargo of 2,400 tons of merchandise. Olson was standing watch at the wheel when he suddenly ran to one side of the boat and jumped into the water. On account of the big, high-rolling waves,

all efforts to rescue him were hopeless. Olson had told his mates that he could not live without his sweetheart.
Founder's Day at Carnegie Institute.

 Pittsburgh, Pa., April 28.—The annual celebration of Founder's day in honor of Andrew Carnegie, was brilliantly observed at Carnegie institute this after-

noon. Ambassador Bryce delivered the principal address, taking as his subject "The Influence of Modern Science Upon Modern Thought." Other speakers were W. T. Hornaday, director of the New York zoological park, and Henry E. Krebsel, musical critic of the New York Tribune. The exercises were followed by the award of prizes by the international art jury for 1908.

HEPBURN ACT IN FORCE TOMORROW

 Seattle, Wash., April 29.—On and after tomorrow, under the Hepburn act, it will be unlawful for any railroad to transport from one state to another

any article which it has manufactured or mined, other than such commodities that it needs and uses in the conduct of its own business. In anticipation of the enforcement of the law, United States District Attorney Elmer B. Todd has received a letter from the department of justice asking whether, according to common report, there are any railroad companies whose present

practice would be a violation of the clause. Mr. Todd replied that he knew of no railroad whose practice in Washington would be a violation of the law, but that if he received information of any transgressions of the law he would report them at once.
