RATE NO GOOD TO PENDLETON PEOPLE

Judge Lowell Says Proposed Week's End Arrangement Is Not Acceptable.

(Union Bureau of The Journal, 367 State Street.)

Boise, Or., May 1.—In response to a request from the Oregon state railroad commission, Judge Stephen A. Lowell of

Pendleton writes that a special week's end rate on the O. R. & N. between Portland and Pendleton would be of little value. Citizens of Pendleton had asked that the railroad commission use its influence to obtain for the people of that city a Saturday to Monday rate of one and one-third fare.

"Under such an arrangement," says Judge Lowell, "people of Pendleton would be compelled to use the night train on Saturday and the Sunday evening train returning. If it were possible to leave Pendleton on any train Saturday returning Monday, some benefit might be derived from it."

Bishop O'Gorman's Birthday.

St. Louis, Mo., May 1.—St. Rev.

Thomas O'Gorman, bishop of the Roman Catholic diocese of Sioux Falls, was 65 years old today. Bishop O'Gorman is regarded as one of the most learned of the Catholic prelates in America. Born in Boston in 1843, he came west with his parents at an early age and received his early schooling in Chicago and St. Paul. He then went to France, where he spent 12 years in study. Upon his return to the United States he took a prominent place among Catholic educators. He was the first president of St. Thomas college in Minnesota and prior to his elevation to the bishopric in 1894 he had been for five years one of the instructors at the Catholic university at Washington.

UMATILLA INDIAN REVIVAL OPENED

Pendleton, Or., May 1.—The Presbyterian evangelical meetings to be held by the Indians upon the reservation commenced last night and many Indians are now here from the reservations of the northwest to attend them. The meetings will be held in a large tent near the Presbyterian mission. The first meeting was conducted by Rev. Mount Arthur. The sermon was delivered by Rev. Robert Parsons, Indian evangelist of Cottonwood, Idaho. A large delegation of nearly one hundred Indians came in last evening from the Nez Perce, Warm Springs, Yakima and other reservations. This afternoon at 2 o'clock a social will be held in the big revival tent under the auspices of the Christian Endeavor society. These meetings will continue several weeks and the Indians of the Umatilla reservation will give the members of other tribes a hearty welcome.

UMATILLAS PAY BILLS PROMPTLY

Pendleton, Or., May 1.—The payment of \$50,000 to the Umatilla Indians by the government this week has resulted

in the Indians paying up their store bills and standing accounts and practically all other obligations. Many of the leading Indians have large accounts with business houses and the discharge of these obligations has been made prompt under this payment of funds than under any former payment in the history of the tribe. Agent Arthur E. McPartridge encourages them in meeting their obligations and has been largely instrumental in the changed condition of the tribe in the past year. More children have been in school at the agency than ever before.

Elko-Boise Phone System.

Boise, Idaho, May 1.—It is reported that an independent telephone line is

now being constructed from Elko, Nevada, to Mountain Home, and it is understood it will be extended from the latter place to Boise some time during 1908, which will give this city a direct line into the heart of Nevada. It is thought the exchange of the new system will be established here. The installation will give Boise three distinct systems.

Medical Board Next at Boise.
