WEATHER REPORT

The depression over British Columbia The depression over British Columbia remains stationary. It is slowly increasing in energy, but no rain has yet resulted from this development excepting small amounts at Tatoosh Island and Blaine, Washington, at both of which stations rain was falling at time of observation. Cloudiness prevailed over western Oregon and western Washington, with generally stationary temperatures excepting at Portland, where the weather was decidedly cooler. Throughout the district east of the Cascade mountains the skies were generally clear, with temperatures considerably higher than yesterday morning. A high area overlies the southern Calla high area overlies the southern Callfornia coast, and a ridge of high pressure extends from the Canadian province of Alberta southeastward to the Gulf of Mexico. Fair weather prevails in consequence over the southwest, along the eastern slope of the Rocky mountains, and over the lower Mississippi valley. Excepting at Denver, where there was light precipitation, no rain was reported from any station rain was reported from any station throughout these districts. The storm area over the eastern states has con-tinued its northeasterly movement and is now passing off the New England coast, General rains along the Atlantic coast, the Ohio valley and the lower lake region have attended this movement.

The indications point to showers over this entire forecast district tonight and Saturday.
