Mrs. Heatley said that one day while her husband was writing she suggested to him that he tell his mother about his having been drunk the night before. His reply was to hurl the ink bottle at her. He missed, but the ink splattered over the bed and the wall.

Mrs. George Frank Scott, the plaintiff's mother, told about having furnished money for her son-in-law to go into the grocery business. This was not successful, and it was reported that when Heatley went out to take orders he would remain an hour or more at the homes of feminine customers. Mrs. Heatley said she found that her husband made dates with other women and when she questioned him about it he cursed her. They were married in February, 1906, in Santa Rosa, California, and separated last November.

Three Months Enough. Three months of married life was sufficient for Mrs. Blanch Winans, according to the divorce suit filed by her in the circuit court yesterday. She said she lived with her husband for three months, but she left without cause or explanation on the date of desertion being July 23, 1907.

## NINE MILLION TO BUILD 5,000 HOUSES

Brazilian Capital Adopts Unique Method of Caring for Laboring Class.

Rio de Janeiro, as a municipality, has assumed the task of housing a large portion of the city's poorest laboring population. The poorest class of laborers in many of the larger South American cities are wretchedly housed at exorbitant rentals. These people have no hope of bettering their condition, and in order to furnish them with at least sanitary surroundings the city of Rio has recently negotiated a sale of bonds to the amount of \$9,000,000, which is to be used in building 5,000 small dwellings.
