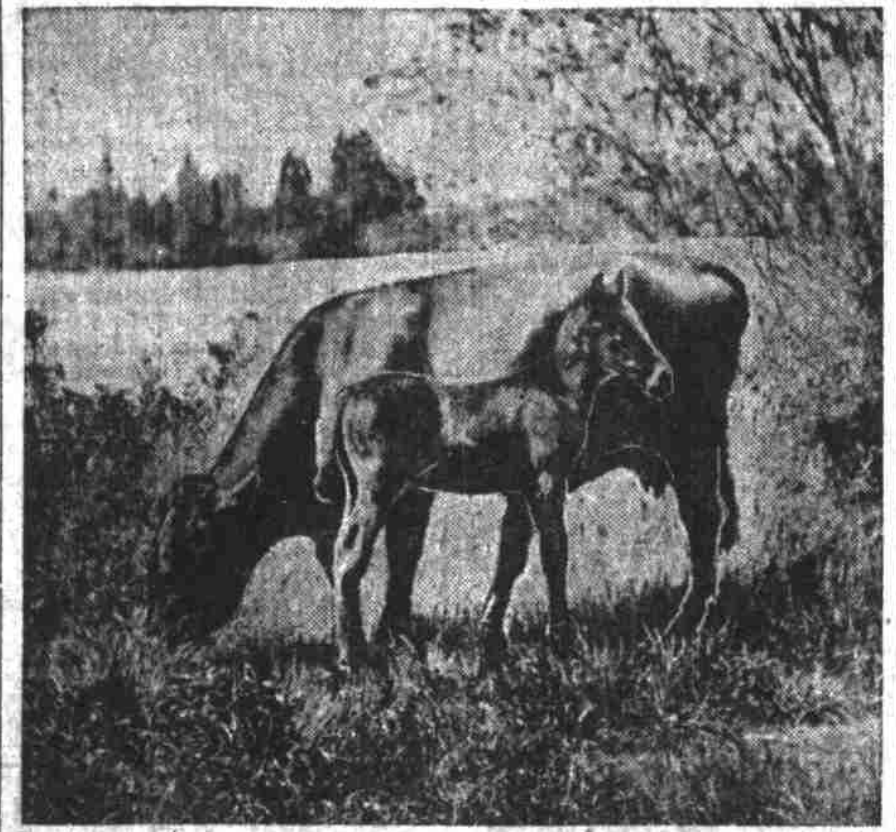

The heavy surf made it difficult to reach the stranded hulk. Lines were shot to the wreck, but failed to reach. The lifeboat was chieftained. Five of the ship's crew tried to put off on a life raft and two of them were drowned, the others were picked up after a thrilling experience. The Minnie E. Kelton was built at West Bay City, Michigan, in 1894 and is of the following dimensions: Length, 171 feet; beam, 42 feet; depth of hold, 11.3 feet. She registered 632 tons gross and 503 tons net.

GRANT LANDS (Continued from Page One.) valleys" said Mr. Hunter, "including the Sprague river valley, Drew's valley and Callow valley. But these are on a limited scale. The largest irrigation project, and one that will be immediately developed, is already surveyed, and will take the water from the Cottonwood river, upon which is located one of the best reservoir sites to be found in the country. It is a natural reservoir, and with small expense can be made to store sufficient water to serve all the grant lands in Goose Lake valley, and some additional lands. The survey was made by an engineer of the Oregon Short Line.
