

FOUR STEAMERS MAKE HARBOR

Three in From San Francisco and One From Coos Bay.

NORWEGIAN FREIGHTER HERE FOR LUMBER

Steamer Breakwater's Cargo Shifts in Strong Blow When Mouth of Columbia River—Northland and Homer Bring Freight.

Four steamers arrived in the harbor during the night, and the Harriman liner Rose City will be in late this evening.

The Norwegian steamer Hornelen came from the Bay City in ballast to load lumber for Panama and has already begun loading at the mills of the Portland Lumber company.

The steam schooner Homer and Northland reached Couch street with full cargoes of freight and many passengers from San Francisco and the steamer Breakwater reached Oak street dock at 2 o'clock this morning.

On account of heavy weather outside and a long delay at Astoria, where 2,000 cases of salmon and a couple hundred tons of coal were discharged.

Officers of the three coasters report having encountered rather severe weather all the way up the coast.

Captain Erickson of the Northland reports having met the Puget sound fleet of eight vessels bound for San Francisco. The Northland passed within a mile of them Saturday night off Cape Mearns, and the passengers all got out to take a look at the little but the lights and silhouettes of the battleships were visible.

Captain Dorris of the Homer reports having met the eight warships off the mouth of the Columbia river Saturday afternoon. They were about three miles distant but within plain view.

The Northland discharged part of her freight at Couch street dock and then shifted to Oak street to finish. She will load lumber at the mills of the Portland Lumber company for a return cargo.

The Homer brought 200 tons of salt and general merchandise which is being discharged at Couch street dock. She will leave for San Pedro via San Francisco tomorrow night with a cargo of wheat.

The steam schooner Yosemite, which arrived at Astoria yesterday from San Francisco, went to Goble to load lumber for a return cargo.

She left San Francisco Thursday night and made a good run up the coast. The steamer Shoshone is due to arrive in the river this afternoon to load lumber. She left San Francisco Friday night.
