Franz Josef Celebrates His Sixtieth Anniversary and Vienna Is Gaily Decorated in His Honor—Congratulated by Rulers.

Vienna, May 7.—The emperor of Germany and four ruling German kings and princes personally congratulated the venerable Emperor Franz Josef today on the sixtieth anniversary of his accession to the Austro-Hungarian throne. The ceremony took place at the Schonbrunn palace just outside of Vienna. It was the most brilliant royal gathering Europe has known during the present generation. There has been no such occasion at Vienna nearly 100 years ago, when the map of Europe was rearranged after the great Napoleon had changed its boundaries.
