

DETECTIVES THOUGHT THEY HAD SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO WARRANT HOLDING HIM—GRITZMACHER KEEPS NEWSPAPERMEN AWAY.

Detectives think they have sufficient evidence to warrant holding him—Gritzmacher keeps newspapermen away.

Edward H. Martin will be indicted for the murder of Nathan Wolff this afternoon, the police believing that they have secured sufficient evidence to warrant their holding him to the circuit court for the crime.

Chief of Police Gritzmacher and Captain of Detectives Batty announced today that they were positive in their own minds that Martin is the guilty man, and that he had no accomplice in the murder.

In the meantime, however, many stories are coming up from reputable sources that some of the police officers view the case and others to show that it is entirely erroneous. One of the most important of these came to light this morning and is being investigated by the detective department.

The next day they appeared in the city. They were wearing watches, chains and diamond pins. One of the men has a diamond ring. They are known to have been in a letter at the O. I. C. wholesale liquor house last Saturday. The liquor people have not been giving revolvers as prizes.

The other man was seen to remove a man's knife from his pocket. He explained that he had been teaching someone how to act, and had used the knife for the purpose. Both men are said to have bragged during the past week that they have all the money they need, and intended quitting work. They are known to have been in the vicinity of the murder scene.

PRISONS FOR THE SAVER FRIENDS OF LATE C. A. COGSWELL PAY HIM RESPECT IN BRIEF SPEECHES.

Friends of late C. A. Cogswell pay him respect in brief speeches.

Old friends of the late Senator Charles A. Cogswell, some of whom had measured swords with him in legal combat and profited thereby, gathered at the courthouse this morning to hear the last words to be formally spoken by the legal profession.

Mr. Cogswell was not actively in practice in Portland, his public service and personal work were so well known that department No. 1 was comfortably filled when Presiding Judge Gantenbein and his three colleagues ascended the bench to receive the report of the committee named to draft resolutions of respect.

George W. Stapleton was chairman of this committee, the other members being R. W. Montague, Joseph Simon, Judge L. R. Webster and Ralph E. Moody. Mr. Stapleton presented the resolutions, which were read, adopted and ordered spread on the minutes of the court.

Mr. Montague spoke feelingly of his personal friendship for Mr. Cogswell and referred to him as an example of what a man may accomplish in the profession usually demands. Not admitted to the bar until he was 25 years of age, he made his name in the profession in his cases and was more thorough in preparing them.

W. D. Patton said that Cogswell was one of the men whose word was as good as a stipulation. He praised the unflinching courage and high ideals of the late attorney.

Judge Webster referred to earlier days in southern Oregon, when he and Cogswell took long stage rides together, and to the time when the speaker defeated Cogswell for election as circuit judge. Uprightness and ability with a distillate of chivalry and falsehood were referred to as characteristic traits of the deceased.

W. D. Patton said that Cogswell held office-room for years, spoke feelingly of his relations with the late senator, and related several incidents showing the man's devotion to duty and conscientious work. He said Cogswell was the best friend he had in the city of Oregon.
