ADVANCE OF JUDAISM IN MODERN TIMES
Subject of Rabbi Koch at Anniversary of Temple Beth Israel.

Interesting addresses and a pleasant musical service marked the celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the Congregation Beth Israel at the temple last evening. The visiting rabbi, Samuel Koch of Seattle made the principal address of the evening. Rabbi Wise sketched the history of the organization and Rabbi Bloch, formerly in charge of the congregation, delivered the benediction.

Rabbi Koch spoke of the advance of Judaism and of the remarkable progress made by it in modern times in every line of industrial and social activity.

"The 60,000 Jews of 1860," said Dr. Koch, "are now 1,000,000 and more. The 500 Jews of the northwestern states have become some 15,000. In New York today there are more Jews than were in Jerusalem in the days of David's glory."

"The awakening of Jewish self-consciousness is one of the remarkable facts of the American civilization. Judaism has a memorable message for our country and our time. Selfishness is stalking in the land. Judaism has wrapped its pall about it; money is preferred to righteousness; power to character; bitterness to brotherhood. Judaism demands the spiritualization of life and the common things of every day.

"If the world need Judaism, Judaism needs the Jew, too. This is the duty of the Jew-American to the state; to so identify himself with its best interests that he may bring out its inherent strength. Judaism needs earnest, conscientious, aggressive Jews; Jews by conviction, not cowardly, not timid, not accommodating Jews; social, political, accidental Jews—Jews by accident; but Jews with the strength to realize their responsibilities with the foresight to appreciate the possibilities of the future, and to demand the respect that belongs to them."
