OREGON SHAD GOES TO FAR-OFF CHINA. Shipping fresh shad to China is a new scheme of Columbia river packers who have in previous years been forced to throw away a large per cent of their catch. Shad are caught in great quantities in the Columbia during the spring salmon season and heretofore they have been a drug on the market around 2 1/2 a pound during the flush of the season. Some shipments are also being made to Chicago and New York by cold storage operators.

Lightning struck a wire of the Folsom Power company and burned out one of the five generators in the powerhouse, but considerable expense will be involved in replacing the wrecked generator.
