

FEAR ATTEMPT TO WRECK SHIPS

Government Orders Sailors to Keep Strangers Out of the Engine-Rooms.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, May 14.—A special order has been issued by Admiral Thomas directed to the fleet captains directing them to take every precaution to prevent any strangers from gaining access to the engine or fire rooms of their ships.

The issuance of the order has caused a great deal of comment among the officers of the fleet, as a general order is already in force prohibiting strangers from visiting the engine rooms.

The man is said to have operated in Chicago, Boston, Buffalo, Peoria, Minneapolis and Kansas City under numerous aliases, as a fake commission produce dealer. His scheme, it is alleged, was to establish a sumptuous office and advertise that he would pay slightly over the market price for extra fine farm produce, and to receive the articles easily disposed of for cash.
