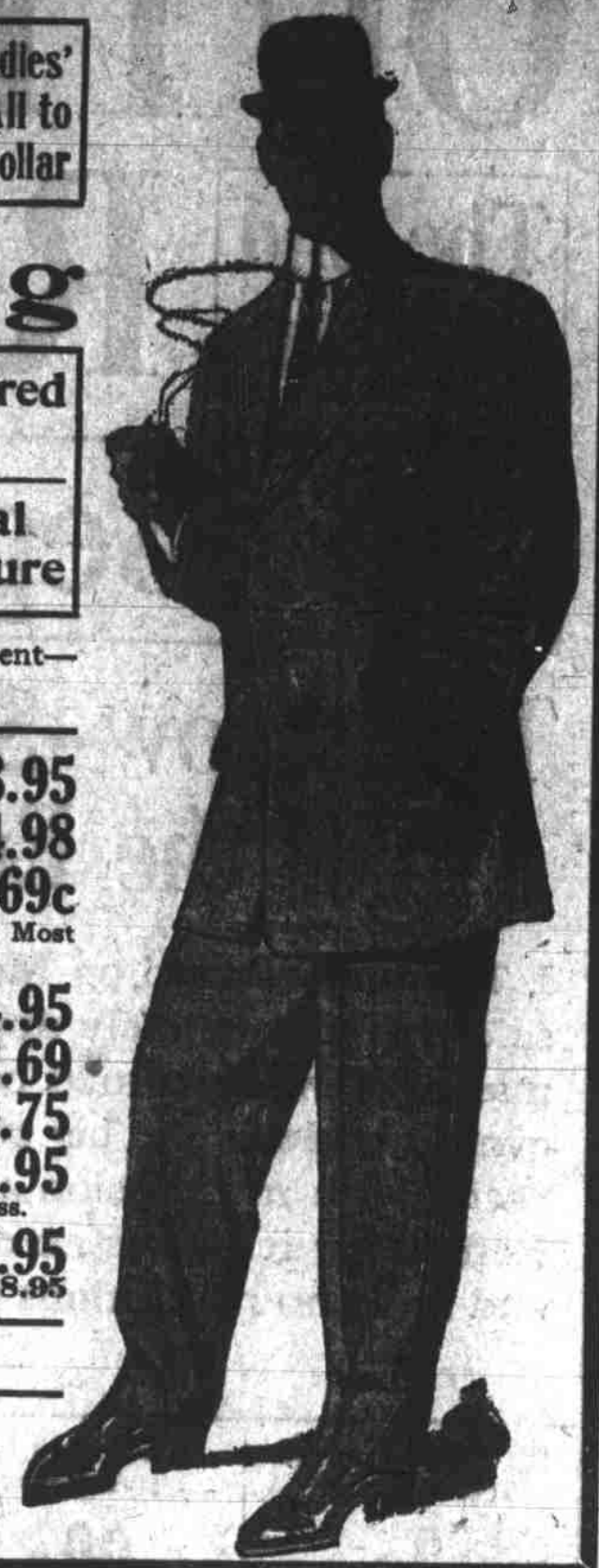

CHRISTIAN ALLIANCE CONVENTION OPENS

Dr. Bayles and Rev. Isaac Hess Among Prominent Men Present.

The annual convention of the Christian and Missionary alliance opened last night at the Alliance chapel, corner East Ninth and Clay streets, with a good attendance. The address of the evening

The address by Rev. Milton M. Bayles, D. D., and their secretary of the alliance, who gave an interesting talk on missions. Dr. Bayles is a man of national reputation who has been closely associated with Dr. A. B. Simpson, the founder and first president of the alliance. He served as associate pastor with Dr. Simpson and has spent 19 years in Chicago as pastor. Dr. Bayles is also an author of some note, whose works on the number of 20,000 copies are now in circulation.

Another prominent speaker in attendance at the convention is Rev. Isaac Hess, missionary to China, who during the past year has been traveling through the country and speaking in the interest of the alliance. Rev. Hess was formerly a prosperous farmer, and then a figure in politics and was prominent in financial affairs in Pennsylvania. Twelve years ago he renounced all that his position and influence gave him and sailed for China to preach the gospel. Both of these men will be heard at the convention, which continues with services today at 2:30 and 7:30, tomorrow at the same hours and Sunday with services at 10:30, 2:30 and 7:30. During this western tour conventions have been held at Seattle, Bellingham, Spokane, Everett and Chehalis. "The offering" mission purposes, and Rev. C. D. Sawtelle, the president of the alliance in this city, "have been far in excess of that received in other years, and the conventions have been full of interest. The Christian and Missionary alliance is an organization about 25 years old. It now has 300 missionaries in the foreign field. Our work is interdenominational, and the adherents are communicants in many of the churches.
