COUNCIL TO DISPOSE OF CABLE, SAYS LANE

Members Bought It, Now They Can Tell Electrician What to Do With It.

Members of the fire committee of the executive board voted yesterday to ask the council to pass an ordinance forbidding entertainments or allowing persons to live over automobile garages. This followed the report of Chief Campbell, who declared that the Portland Kennel club had held its dog show above the Crowe-Graham garage, Fifteenth and Washington streets, without license or permit from the city. Campbell said that if he had known the show was to have been held he would have stopped it because he regards it as a dangerous practice.

The committee authorized the city auditor to advertise for bids for an automobile for Chief Campbell. Money was appropriated for the "buss" wagon at the beginning of the year and it is probable that the machine will be in operation in several weeks.

City Treasurer Verlein appeared before the committee and notified the members that moving picture shows would have to secure the approval of the executive board before he would grant them permits. Heretofore the permits have been issued upon the recommendation of the fire chief and fire marshal.

City Electrician Savariou asked the committee what they wanted done with the cable purchased last year and which caused the row between the majority party of the council and Mayor Lane. Savariou was told by Mayor Lane to appear before the council and ask the members what they wanted done with the cable. Mayor Lane said the cable was purchased by the council and it is the duty of the councilmen to dispose of it.

Over 100 persons attended the mass meeting of the Mount Scott Annexation club in Nashville hall on the Mount Scott carline, last evening. Miller Murdoch, Green C. Loveand and W. L. Lightner, county commissioner, were among the speakers who told of the advantages of annexation to Portland. Benefit of having Bull Run water throughout the Mount Scott district was given as one of the principal reasons for annexation. The local company is already troubled with a shortage, and has cut the hours for sprinkling to two in the morning and two in the evening. Stationary sprinklers are prohibited.

Biscuit Short Cake

- One quart of flour.
- One scant pint of water or milk.
- One-half cup of COLUMBIA leaf lard.
- One heaping teaspoonful of salt.
- Three teaspoonful of baking powder.
- One teaspoonful of sugar.

Mix the ingredients together and sift into bowl. Add the lard. Chop lightly with knife until lard and ingredients are well mixed, then add water or milk and stir lightly. All ingredients, especially the lard, should be very cold.

Bake in well-greased tins until a light brown. Have the berries chopped and sugared one-half hour before using. When cake is baked (takes about 15 minutes in quick oven), take out and split open as you would a biscuit and butter both sides well; sugar, then pour in berries on bottom crust, and put top crust on again. Put a number of whole berries on top. Sprinkle with powdered sugar and serve immediately with whipped cream.
