WEATHER REPORT

The pressure remains comparatively high over the Oregon coast and correspondingly low over British Columbia. Light general rain has fallen in consecutive days over western Oregon and western Washington during the last 12 hours. East of the Cascades no precipitation occurred excepting an insignificant amount at Walla Walla, where a light rain was falling at time of report. The Nebraska disturbance has drifted central over Oklahoma. It is decidedly less energetic than yesterday morning when the attendant rain was confined to a comparatively small area. Few rainfalls recorded, however, at a few stations were unusually heavy. General rains also fell along the entire Atlantic coast. Cloudy weather with showers in Indiana over western Oregon and western Washington tonight and Friday, while fair weather is probable over the remainder of the district. It will probably be warmer tonight in southern Idaho.
