PORTLAND AGAIN LEADS IN WHEAT

Department of Commerce and Labor Gives Interesting Statistics.

NEW YORK HOLDS SECOND PLACE

Oregon Port Exported Nearly One Third of All Wheat Sent Away to Foreign Ports in United States During April.

Portland again took the lead as a wheat shipping port in the United States during the month of April, New York being second in point of prominence, according to statistics compiled by the Department of Commerce and Labor.

All told 3,505,501 bushels wheat were exported during April, and of that quantity, 1,108,314 bushels were shipped from Portland, this meaning that about one-third of the entire quantity exported from the states was sent out through this port.

In point of prominence as an individual port in regard to wheat shipments for the month of April, Portland holds second place in the states, New York leading with 19,443 bushels, Portland exporting 59,345 bushels, while the combined shipments of the Puget sound ports were 12,707,893 bushels.
