TAKE FISH CASE TO THE SUPREME COURT

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Olympia, Wash., May 21.—Suggesting that the matter be taken to the supreme court of the United States, A. W. Crew, Ford, attorney-general of Oregon, has

forwarded to Attorney-General John D. Atkinson of this state a copy of the decision of the supreme court of the state of Oregon affirming the conviction of Christ Nelson on a charge of violating the fishing laws of Oregon. Nelson is a resident of the state of Washington and was fishing with a purse net on the Washington side of the river. Fares net fishing is licensed by this state but prohibited by Oregon.

Nelson had the requisite Washington license. The Oregon supreme court held that where adjoining states have concurrent jurisdiction on the waters forming their boundaries, as have Washington and Oregon, the laws of each state regulating the common right to take fish from such waters are valid and binding when not in conflict; that if there is a conflict, the law of that state which is the

most restrictive in character must prevail, and to that extent the state which first assumes jurisdiction to the exclusion of the other. Chief Justice Bean of Oregon says in this connection: "If this is not so and the states of Oregon and Washington must join in regulations to protect the fish industry on the Columbia river, a thing they have heretofore been unable to do, the

river will practically become a common fishing ground, without limitation or restriction, and one of the greatest industries on the coast be speedily destroyed. Attorney-General Crawford expresses the view that the question is very important for both states. The entire subject has been referred by the attorney-general of this state to Assistant Attorney-General E. C. Macdonald of

Spokane, who represented Washington in the Columbia river boundary dispute. Mr. Macdonald is requested to take such measures as he believes right and proper to protect the interests of the fishermen of Washington. Bull Derailed an Engine. From the London Standard. While the Andalusian express was

traveling at the rate of 30 miles an hour a bull suddenly appeared on the line near the village of Rabonales. Before the driver could pull up the bull rushed at the express with lowered head, and the impact was so terrific that the engine was derailed. The driver applied the brakes just in time to prevent the entire train from falling over an embankment. A fresh engine secured, the express proceeded.
