PHYSICIAN FINED IN LIQUOR CASE
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Enterprise, Or., May 22.—In the case of the state against Dr. Monkman, charged with selling intoxicating liquor contrary to the liquor law, the jury has returned a verdict of guilty. Judge

Crawford imposed a fine of \$400 and costs. In 1906 while Dr. Monkman was practicing medicine at Flora, he sold a quart of alcohol to a rancher who told the doctor that he wanted it for a sick horse. There was no drug store in Flora and the doctor kept a certain quantity of drugs in his office for use in his practice. At the time the alcohol was sold the doctor made out a certificate as to the sale of the alcohol,

but it was not in accordance with the form prescribed by the liquor law.

Why La Grande Rejoices.

La Grande, Or., May 22.—There was great rejoicing here when the telegram came from Senator Fulton stating that he had got through the senate an appropriation of \$65,000 for a postoffice building in this city. A telegram received from him Wednesday first gave the news. It was worded in such a way as to lead to some doubt as to whether La Grande was to have a postoffice building and an additional appropriation of \$65,000 for another federal building, or only the postoffice. Doubt about that question was settled by another message from Senator Fulton yesterday in which he said the total appropriation

was \$65,000, and was for a postoffice building.

The recent Republican convention was not a representative body. Had delegates to Chicago named by it been obliged to pass through the ordeal of a direct primary perhaps not all of them would be packing their suit cases for the lake metropolis.

ASHLAND COMPLETING HER SEWER SYSTEM
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Ashland, Or., May 22.—Bids were opened by the city council Wednesday night for the construction of sewers in districts Nos. 11 and 12. The bid of E.

E. Phipps to construct both sewers at the total cost of \$5,135.75 was accepted. The construction of these two sewers will complete the sewer system for Ashland as originally projected and surveyed and leaves only a small unurban section unsewered. With the sewer system, Ashland will be able to present sanitary conditions unequalled by any city in the

state.
