

CABRERA KILLS POLITICAL FOES President of Guatemala Kidnaps Enemies and Has Them Shot.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, May 23.—Passengers arriving here on the Pacific Mail liner San Jose from the port of San Jose, Guatemala, today tell a story of swift and mysterious vengeance on the part of President Cabrera by which the most prominent men in that country who were supposed to have been dis- appearing and each disappearance has been followed by a burial at the penitentiary. They give names of nine men who have not been seen lately and whose friends and relatives have given up as victims of the president's anger. The campaign followed an attempt to assassinate Cabrera by his body guard of students which he had drawn from the Guatemala military academy. This was immediately followed by the announcement that four members of the guard had been executed the penitentiary and it was supposed the president had closed the case. A few days later, however, the swift and silent campaign of vengeance was under way. A prominent man would disappear from his home in the night. The next morning at day break his friends would hear the roar of a volley of muskets within the penitentiary walls and from points of vantage they later would observe the burial in the prison cemetery of a body wrapped in coarse cloth. This performance was repeated so often and so consistently that it soon became the belief of the citizens that Cabrera has determined to exterminate all those he considers his enemies. The constant fear that he may be next is tugging at the heart of every man of importance in the country who has not been closely allied with the interests of the president. Cabrera has conducted such a close censorship that no news of the "disappearances" has been allowed to go out of the country, according to the refugees. The victims include many men well known in the big cities along the Pacific coast. A partial list was compiled by the passengers on the ship as follows: Dr. Mateo Zayas, chief surgeon of the army; Juan Viteri, Adolfo Viteri, Manuel Prado and Eduardo Prado, planters; Eduardo Rubio, capitalist; Francisco Valladores and Manuel Herrera, lawyers; Francisco Ruiz, physician, and at least a dozen other civilians, army officers and students.

THE EMULATION OF FRENCH MONARCH Graft Probers at Olympia March Down Almost Before They March Up.

Olympia, Wash., May 23.—That because of an apparent desire on the part of some of the grand jurors to do some of the grand jury of importance scheduled for presentation to the grand jury were withheld by the prosecuting attorney, and will be taken into court on ordinary criminal information, is following the final adjournment of the jury yesterday afternoon. The grand jury, the first to sit in this county since territorial days, was heralded as an inquisitorial body that would unearth numerous cases of public grafting, but the jury completed its labors in five days and returned but four indictments, none of which involves public affairs. No indictment was returned on the one graft charge known to have been presented to the jury. This was the charge previously contained in an information filed by the prosecuting attorney that J. P. Thacker, a local politician, had endeavored to extort from H. C. Heermans, president of the Olympia Water company, \$500 in return for a promise of the friendship of the city administration. The information had been dismissed on preliminary examination without an indictment having been examined, Mr. Heermans being in the seat at the time. Mr. Heermans and his local manager, C. M. Bolton, were both before the grand jury. It is understood that some of the jurors throughout the sessions showed a disposition to block investigations of charges of public importance, and it is reported, prosecuting attorney finally decided it was useless to proceed further. He refuses to discuss anything that transpired.

STEALS AUTOMOBILE; COLLIDES WITH TREE

San Jose, Cal., May 23.—In his haste to escape pursuers, an unknown thief, riding in a \$7,000 automobile he had stolen from in front of the Empire theatre, collided with a tree near Santa Clara and today a handsome machine lies in a mass of ruins. The auto has been running at a terrific rate of speed when the collision occurred, judging from the damage done. John R. Chanon, vice president of the Santa Clara county automobile club, owner of the car, has just reported his loss Friday night when different persons reported that they saw his machine smashing in the direction of San Francisco, with a young man wearing a chauffeur's cap in charge. A few moments later, while the police were scouring the territory adjacent to San Jose, a telephone message notified police headquarters that a big automobile had collided with a tree near Santa Clara and that no chauffeur could be found. It is thought that the thief headed for San Francisco, and the police of the bay cities have been asked to look out for him.
