

FINEST OF ALL FLATS

Alfred G. Vanderbilt Pays \$13,000 a Year for Piccadilly Abode—Will Entertain During London Horse Show.

(Hearst News by Longest Leased Wire.) London, May 23.—Alfred G. Vanderbilt, whom the English press delight in calling "the richest young man in the world," has taken one of the most "swagger" flats in London. For the privilege of living on the sixth floor overlooking Piccadilly, the famous London thoroughfare, the American millionaire is paying \$10,000 a year. As the rent does not include rates and taxes, there is an extra item of expense of about \$3,000 per annum. To the British public \$10 a week looks like a tall price to pay just to keep a flat roof over one's head, but to the scion of the Vanderbilts, with his experience of \$25,000 suites at the Astoria and one of \$50,000 at the New Plaza, it is a mere bagatelle.

So far as London is concerned, the flats in which young Vanderbilt is now settled are the last word in their line. Nothing like them has ever been attempted in this part of the world, and the Americans, with his "transatlantic ideas of unlimited expenditure," is the only person who has as yet had the nerve to rent one. They are built on the site of the mansion of the late Duke of Cambridge, and stand midway between the high class club district and Mayfair, the home of England's "Four Hundred." Next to them, and stretching up Piccadilly to Apsley house, the town residence of the Duke of Wellington, which suits the park are the several residences occupied by the famous Rothschild family, the kings of finance.

On Park Lane.
The building in which Vanderbilt has taken up his quarters, has a frontage on Piccadilly of almost 70 feet and on Park Lane of about 200 feet. It is of gray granite, rather fantastic and artistically ornamented with glazed green brick. There are six flats (over here they have not yet learned the nice distinction between flat and apartment), each one of which contains 10 large bedrooms, three bathrooms, a number of smoking, billiard and drawing rooms, cloakrooms, bath, halls, bouillottes and a great big ballroom. A man without any family with him ought to worry along on that.

Mr. Vanderbilt has denied that there is any serious trouble between him and his wife, and some time ago there was a rumor that, with his best hair at the head of his establishment, he intended doing quite a little entertaining during the coming London horse show season. The American millionaire has been chosen one of the judges for the show, but will not be an exhibitor as last year.

Smart "Stages."
It is now thought that if he does anything in the way of entertaining it will take the form of "stages" for those associated with him at Olympia. Of course, should he wish to give a collation or two to include the fair sex "Katie" Vanderbilt and her wife will be in town, and his sister-in-law would always be available as a hostess.

Almost any evening of entertaining in a flat would be a novelty for English society. When a smart London matron who lives in a flat wishes to play the part of hostess, she generally takes her friends to the Ritz or to Claridge's. For in the usual run of London flats there is not enough room to do anything much except sleep. Some of them are so small that the servants are compelled to sleep out.

RUEF ALLOWED TIME TO REST

Trials of Ex-Boss of San Francisco Delayed by Order of the Court.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, May 23.—The trial of Ruef in the Parkside cases has been set by Judge Dunne for next Monday.

A continuance, however, will likely be granted as Ruef's attorney, Henry Ach, has gone into the country for a rest.

Assistant District Attorney O'Garra told Judge Lewis that he desired an early trial in the United Railroad case against Ruef, but under representations of Murphy, one of Ruef's attorneys, Judge Lewis allowed the defendant several days' delay on account of the absence of Ach and on account of the recent thirteenth trial.

In the meantime Ruef is continuing his efforts to secure release from the county jail on bail and in doing this will make the demand that the bail is excessive and should be reduced.

A motion has been made by the defense alleging prejudice on the part of Judge Dunne and asking that he be disqualified. This will also come up next week for hearing.

PROFESSOR INJURED WHILE SAVING BOYS

(United Press Leased Wire.) Fresno, Cal., May 23.—Offering himself as a sacrifice in protecting children who were standing in the way of a race horse, Marvin P. Holmes, principal of the Hawthorne grammar school, was probably fatally injured at the opening of the school field meet in this city today. Some boys were on the race course when Mabel C. a well known local horse, came down the track. Holmes saw the danger and ran in front of them, waving to the driver to stop. He could not check the horse, however, before she ran into Holmes. He was trampled under foot, his skull fractured and breast crushed.

40,000 DEATHS FROM FAMINE IN UGANDA
