PROPOSAL TO BUILD SALEM-STAYTON LINE

Stayton, Or., May 27.—A letter was made public at the commercial club meeting Monday evening, in which A. Welch of Portland offered to construct the Salem and Stayton electric line and give two-hour service if the people along the line would subscribe \$50,000 bonds, and the people of Salem another \$50,000, the bonds to run five years at six per cent. The proposition was referred to a committee composed of W. C. Frerks of Stayton, Sherman Swank of Astoria and W. Y. Richardson of Salem.
