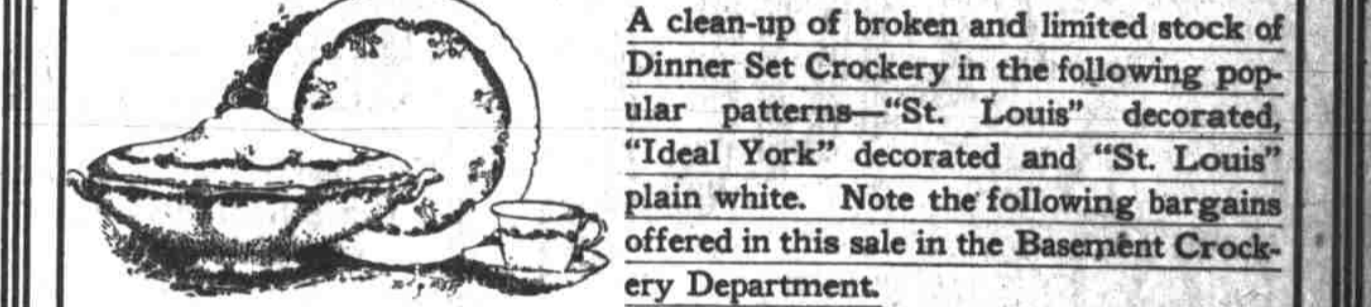
Evening Offshoot of Oregonian Scored by Prominent Astorian for Attempt to Injure the Reputation of Chamberlain by Misstatements.
