

# HE CALLS BIG BLUFF

Captain Bermingham, Chief Inspector of Vessels at San Francisco, Refuses to Allow Masters and Pilots to Run His Department.

(United Press Special Wire.)  
San Francisco, May 28.—A merry war is on between Captain Bermingham, chief inspector of vessels here, and 800 masters and pilots who threaten to surrender their licenses if charges are preferred against the masters of the steamers J. D. Peters, Modoc and Fernwood, who are accused of violating regulations by blowing whistles on the day the Atlantic fleet entered San Francisco bay.

Bermingham said that he intended to let the three masters off with a light fine, but now that 800 captains and pilots have issued a deft he is going to make it hot for some one.

The inspector, who is now in the north, says in a letter received here today: "I am informed by dispatches in the papers that the masters and pilots in California, numbering about 800, are going to hand to the United States local board their licenses if three or four of their number are mulcted for the incessant and unusual blowing of whistles the day the fleet arrived there, a clear violation of the law. As their offenses were the first to be tried under the new law, I had intended that, if found guilty, they be given a light sentence, but if they are about to hurl defiance with a view of intimidating me, it will be the worse for them."
