

LAST RALLY IS TONIGHT

STATE SENATOR NO. 1 MEN THE MEN TO VOTE FOR

Candidates for the state legislature who have openly declared themselves in favor of Statement No. 1 and by so doing have shown their opposition to political debauchery in the state legislature, are the candidates who should be elected next Monday by a decisive vote.

La Follette's friends caution him against the attempt on account of his recent illness, but he stands ready to remain at his desk, speaking 48 hours if necessary, having his meals brought to him in the chamber. If he finds one to help him he will kill the bill.

Governor Chamberlain Will Address Mass Meeting in Hills Hall, Williams Avenue and Russell Street—Possibly Open Air Speech.

Governor Chamberlain will close his campaign for the United States senatorship with a mass meeting and rally tonight at 8 o'clock at Hill's hall on Williams avenue and Russell street. At this meeting the governor will be the principal speaker of the evening, though the other candidates who have been making a tour of the county with him will also be present and will make short addresses in their own behalf.

If the weather permits the meeting will be held out of doors because of the fact that there will be no possibility of accommodating all of those who desire to hear the governor and addressors in the city who desire to attend the meeting and listen to his final campaign address.

At the same time the meeting is being held at Hill's hall there will be another meeting held at Twenty-sixth and Nicolai streets. This meeting will be addressed by a number of the candidates for office on the Democratic ticket and it is very probable that Governor Chamberlain will make a short address there, provided he is able to finish his main address at Hill's hall in time to reach the other meeting place.

Governor Chamberlain, accompanied by a number of other candidates, made a tour of the eastern part of the county today in an automobile. Starting at Sellwood, where he addressed a fair sized crowd at 2 o'clock, the governor then went to Astoria, and on around the circle. At all of the places where he stopped the governor was received enthusiastically, large crowds of people being gathered to greet him and listen to his short addresses. Tom Word and Oglesby Young also made short addresses along the route in support of their candidacy for sheriff and railroad commissioner, respectively.

The Republican candidates will close their campaign tonight with a rally at the Empire theatre. Henry E. McGinn and Judge Stephen A. Lowell of Perpetua will be the principal speakers. Frank Hennessy will sing. It is also planned to have some seven or eight automobiles make a tour of the city, each equipped with four or five speakers, who will make good old-fashioned campaign speeches on the street corners.

BURGLARS PROBABLY FLED ON A SPEEDER

One of These Vehicles, Belonging at Oakland, Is Found at Roseburg.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Roseburg, Or., May 29.—The only trace the officers have been able to obtain of the Oakland wholesale robbers is a railway tricycle, or speeder.

which was stolen from the tire factory about two miles this side of Oakland, upon which it is supposed the two men came to this city during the early hours of the morning. The speeder was found in the brush along the river bank just below town yesterday morning, where it is thought they left it, walking thence into town.

No estimate of the amount of money or the valuation of the goods stolen has been arrived at so far.

In the fight at the stockyards at Oakland the burglars dropped two pistols used in their duel with the officers. The guns were picked up in the hog pen, where more than a dozen bullet holes were made by the guns of the police. It is thought the two pistols, which were stolen from Stearns & Chenoweth's hardware store, were emptied and dropped while new arms were brought into play, and the fusillade of bullets from the officers' guns became so strong that the bandits were forced to retreat and leave the guns they had dropped. The pistols were recognized by the proprietors of the hardware store as having come from there.

Aside from this there is nothing to show what course the robbers took in leaving Oakland, and the speeder is a clue that may not prove anything, as no one saw the men who made this 16-mile ride in the small hours of the morning.
