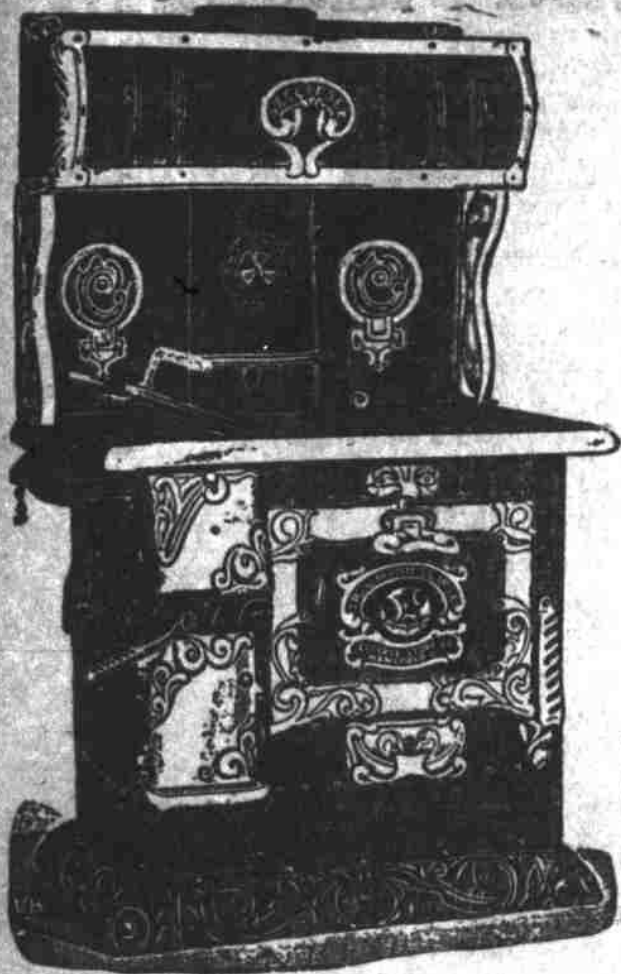

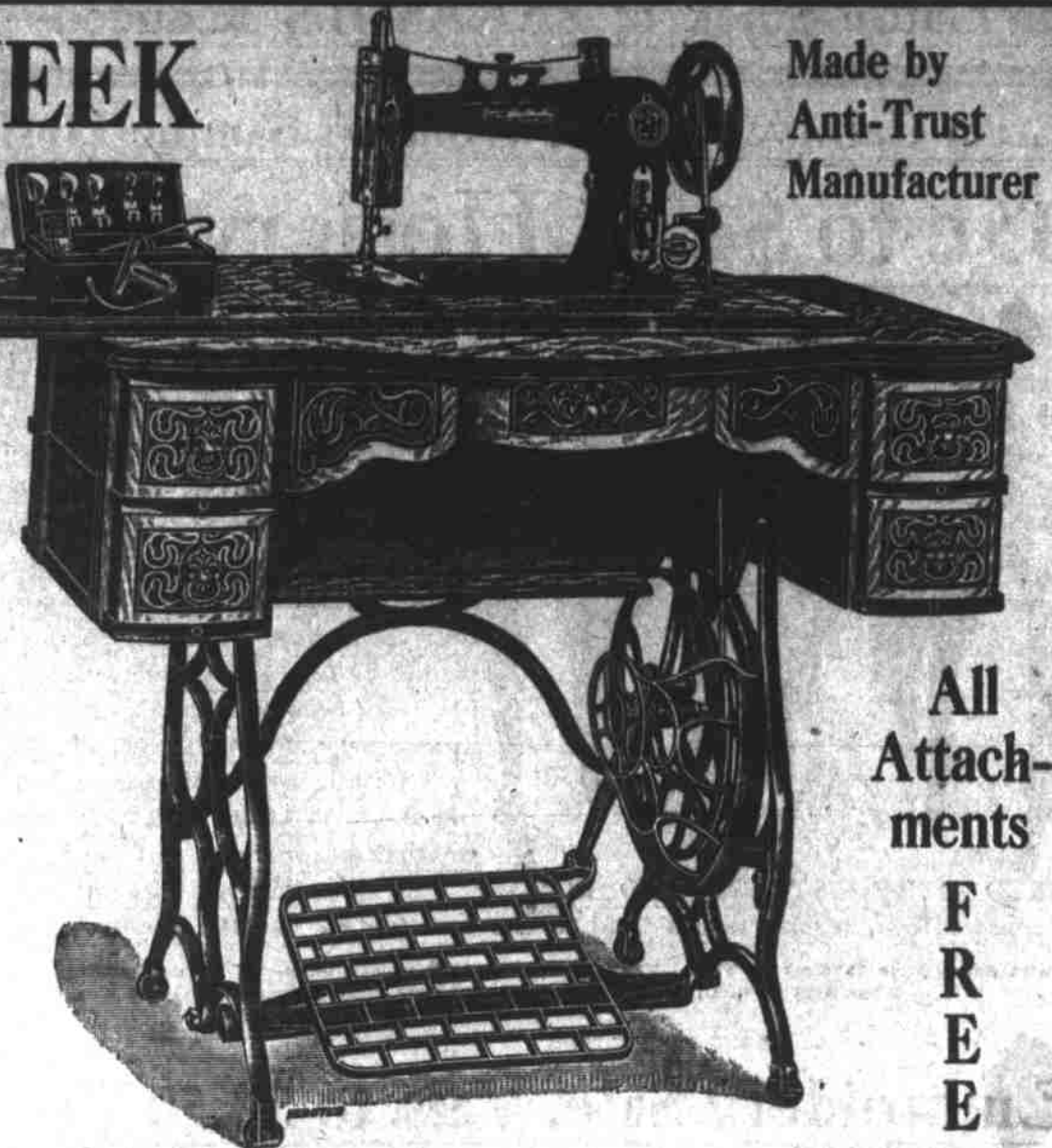

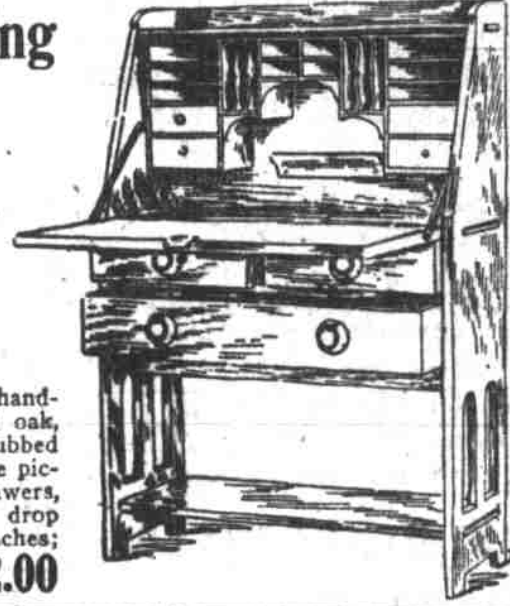

HE'S A CHIP OFF THE OLD BLOCK

Lieutenant Evans Rescues Two Sailors From Angry Mob in Dance Hall.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
San Francisco, June 2.—Lieutenant Frank T. Evans, son of "Fighting Bob", proved early today that he is a chip off the old block when he stood off a crowd of 20 thugs and bangers on about a dancehall in the Barbary coast

district and rescued two sailors of the United States ship Louisiana, who had fallen into the hands of the denizens of the tendorium.

When young Evans saw his fellow sailors in trouble he waded into the crowd and first vigorously and when he was surrounded, drew a revolver and told them that he would shoot the first man that got in his way.

He made his way to the men he wanted to protect and forced three of them to take their hands off them and allow them to go with him.

The crowd was getting angry at the interference and was preparing to rush him when the police arrived on the scene.

Evans wore civilian clothes and was not recognized as a sailor. The police at once placed him under arrest on the charge of carrying a concealed weapon and ordered him to go with them to the city prison.

Having seen that his friends were safe, he readily surrendered and did not tell who he was until he arrived at the central station. There he quickly established his identity and was released on his own recognizance to appear to answer to the charge of carrying a revolver.

Evans was rescued by Evans were William Edmondson and John Wallick. The trouble started at the U. S. dance hall on Pacific street. Evans had come ashore to see the sights and was on the outskirts of the crowd when he observed that a woman was going through the pockets of one of the sailors.

He saw the woman take \$20 from the sailor's jacket at the same time realized that he was being robbed and grabbed the woman, pushing her against the table, knocking it over. This threw the dance hall into wild disorder and the hangers-on would have given them rough treatment if Evans had not suddenly come plunging through the crowd knocking men right and left and brandishing a big revolver, which he said he would use, and he looked like he meant just what he said.

Those who were present said that Lieutenant Evans' use of language never before heard on Barbary coast and it is suggested that he probably learned it from his father.

Lieutenant Evans recently went east with his father, returning last Sunday to duty upon the Louisiana. It is not expected that the charge of carrying a concealed weapon will be pressed against the lieutenant.

SEVERAL THOUSAND PHYSICIANS ATTEND

Fifty-Ninth Annual Session of American Medical Association in Session.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Chicago, June 2.—With clinics arranged for every department of medicine and surgery and with daily sessions planned for a dozen different sections the 59th annual meeting of the American Medical Association was opened in this city today with several thousand physicians and surgeons in attendance from the United States and Canada and many from abroad. For extensiveness of preparation and elaborateness of detail no such assemblage has been held in Chicago for many years.
The incoming delegates, many of whom were accompanied by members of their families, crowd the leading hotels of the city.
The work of the convention is divided among the house of delegates, which opened its deliberations yesterday and which transacts the business for the association, three general meetings of

read several hundred papers on subjects of interest to the medical fraternity. The opening general meeting of the association was called to order in the Auditorium this morning by President Joseph D. Bryant of New York City. The president-elect, Dr. Herbert L. Burrill, of Boston, was introduced and formally installed in office.
At the second general meeting this evening Dr. William S. Thayer of Baltimore delivered the annual oration on medicine and Dr. George W. Crile of Cleveland the oration on surgery.
