

### POLITICAL POT IS BOILING HOT

#### "Fight Is Not Yet Over," Battle Cry for Republican Nomination.

(United Press Leased Wire.)  
Chicago, June 3.—John C. Eversman, confidential man to Congressman William R. McKinley of Illinois, gave out a statement today from the Cannon headquarters that the fight for the nomination on the first ballot are without substantial foundation. Eversman has opened Cannon headquarters here in the Auditorium hotel, and "Uncle" Joe is speeding from Washington in an automobile with Senator James Hemenway of Indiana.  
McKinley, who will manage Cannon's fight at Chicago, will arrive the latter part of the week.  
The Cannon-boomers say that no candidate will have enough strength to get the nomination on the first ballot, and that when the break comes they expect to nominate Cannon.

### LETTER RATE TWO CENTS TO ENGLAND AFTER OCTOBER 1

Washington, June 3.—Uncle Sam can write to John Bull more frequently next fall, for after October 1 it will cost but 2 cents for each letter instead of 6.  
Announcement was made today at the office of the postmaster-general that an

agreement has been perfected by which the letter rate between the United States, England, Ireland and Scotland will be reduced from 6 cents to 2 cents.  
The charge will mean a saving of much money as the trans-Atlantic mails have been increasing rapidly in volume.

### Spain to Stamp Out Anarchy.

Madrid, June 3.—A drastic law against anarchism has been passed by the Spanish senate.  
The law authorizes the government to suppress entirely newspapers which publish any news about anarchism, except the official notes issued by the government, and punishes by imprisonment those publishing such unofficial news. It also empowers the authorities to close clubs and to expel citizens who are suspected of propagating anarchism.

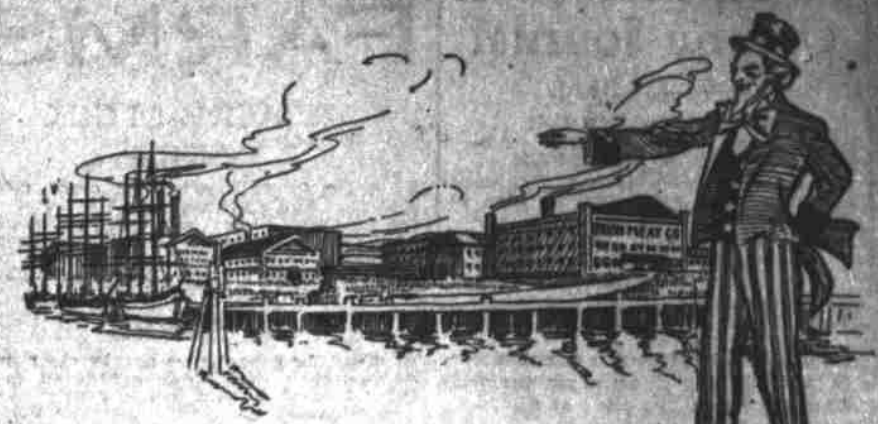
