

PLURALITY NOW 1,710

Chamberlain Is Far in the Lead, With Less Than 600 Votes Yet to Count—Lane Was Only Strong County.

With 191,360 votes counted and less than 400 votes yet to count, George E. Chamberlain's plurality over H. M. Cake is 1,710. Contrary to the earlier reports, Marion county went in favor of Chamberlain by 12. In Multnomah, with a completed though unofficial count, Chamberlain leads by 991. He has carried altogether 14 of the 35 counties in the state. In one county, Douglas, the official count gives the two candidates nearly the same vote, 1,800. Cake carries Clatsop county by just one vote. Curry is the only county in which the count is material. In that county only two precincts have been heard from and these give Cake 48 and Chamberlain 51. It is expected that the complete returns may give county to Cake by a small margin. Benton gave Cake a plurality of 2.

RESULTS IN COUNTY TICKET IN YAMHILL

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) McMinnville, Or., June 4.—The county ticket, Henderson (Rep.) won by about 600 votes over Feely (Dem.) in the contest for sheriff. Jones, for clerk, Foster for treasurer, Miller for assessor, Belt for school superintendent, Herring for surveyor and Tilbury for coroner, all Republicans, are elected by the majorities. All these had practically no opposition. Mahoney (Dem.) and Nickell (Rep.) in the contest for assessor have, respectively, 1,516 and 1,448. For county commissioner, Cummins (Rep.) has 1,313 to 1,218 for Gee (Dem.). The final result of prohibition will be two to one in favor of it. In the results regarding the amendments seven precincts are minus. The legislative increase in salary lost, 395 to 1,860. By a vote of 424 to 1,089 the county is against the location of state institutions elsewhere than at the state capital. An increase in supreme judges was defeated, 427 to 1,364. The change in time for holding elections carried, 1,807 to 487. The act giving the sheriff custody of all prisoners carried, 1,242 to 648. Free transportation went down by 470 to 1,857. The National Guard appropriation was handed down by a vote of 548 for to 1,467 against. The university appropriation was defeated by 881 to 1,511. Woman suffrage lost by 860 to 1,182. The fish bill, marked 218 on the ballot, carried, 1,032 to 794. The Reddy amendment was dealt a knockout by a vote of 653 to 1,236. The single tax amendment went still farther down, 487 to 1,510. The special election amendment received 1,562 for to 455 against. The amendment regarding pluralities, party organizations, etc., stands 945 for to 831 against. The limit of campaign fund bill won by 1,075 to 745. The fish bill marked 323 has 1,072 yeas and 823 noes. The change in choice of jurors and indictment for crime has carried with a vote of 985 to 712. The Hood River county bill was favored with a result of 320 yeas and 521 nays.

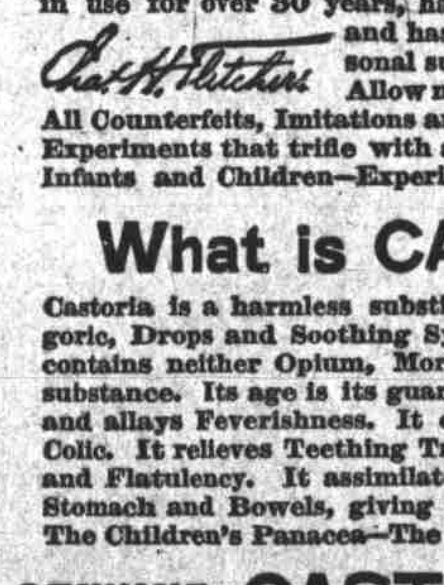
DREYFUS SHOT

(Continued from Page One.) A disastrous scene. All the officials deserve great credit, including United States Ambassador White, who calmly walked on and never faltered. He was showing no signs that he knew anything had happened, though he was nearby when the shots were fired. Crowd fell upon Gregori. It was a few minutes before the general crowd learned of the attack on Dreyfus. Then there was wild excitement. A mob set out to overtake the gendarmes in charge of Gregori. A fight followed in which Gregori sustained several slight cuts on his forehead and he was badly beaten before he reached the police station. Gregori Tested Dreyfus. As military editor of his journal, Gregori brought in close touch with all the affairs of the army and followed the Dreyfus case carefully from the beginning to the end. His sympathies were all against Dreyfus, and his hatred was particularly strong against Zola for his defense of the soldier. He considered the transfer of Zola's body to the Pantheon to be a sacrilege and had openly denounced the government of France for permitting it. He was looked upon as being almost fanatic in his views. His paper yesterday printed a bitter article in which it was charged that the Pantheon was being turned into a sewer by putting the body of Zola there. The exercises began at 9:30 o'clock this morning. After the singing of the Marseillaise, Minister Doumergue delivered an address in which he praised Zola and eulogized him as one of the great thinkers of France. He lauded his literary and political career and said his body had been given its rightful honor.

General Temper Good. I have mixed with the crowd and I find that the general temper is good and the persons of various classes with whom I talked appear to be inclined toward pleasure and celebration rather than mischief. Editor Explains to Police. Editor Gregori, when questioned by the police, said: "I did not fire at Dreyfus, I fired at the government. It is revolting to see the noble army of France raised in an affair of this sort, which, at best, concerned only the government and the Dreyfus family." Dr. Poursif in No Danger. Dr. Poursif, who attended Dreyfus at his home, announced this afternoon that the first bullet struck the arm and failed to do any serious injury. The second penetrated the forearm deeply, a few inches above the wrist, but did not touch the bone. He said his patient was quiet, had no fever and was in no danger. All Paris Is Calm. All sections of the city are calm this evening and there is no danger of an outbreak. People on all sides of the controversy condemn the action of Gregori. The prisoner is 34 years old.

Judge Webster removed the issue from politics in discussing it, and said that it was a matter of an agreement between the legislator who signed the statement and the people who nominated a man for the position. "I think a man should carry out his agreement whether he likes it or not and especially in this case in the present case. He has pledged himself to vote for the nominee selected by the people. He goes into office on that pledge, and it is the one thing that he has to live up to. The same principle is involved as in an agreement between two men. If a man signs Statement No. 1 he agrees to vote for the people's nominee. If he says he will be ought to do it."

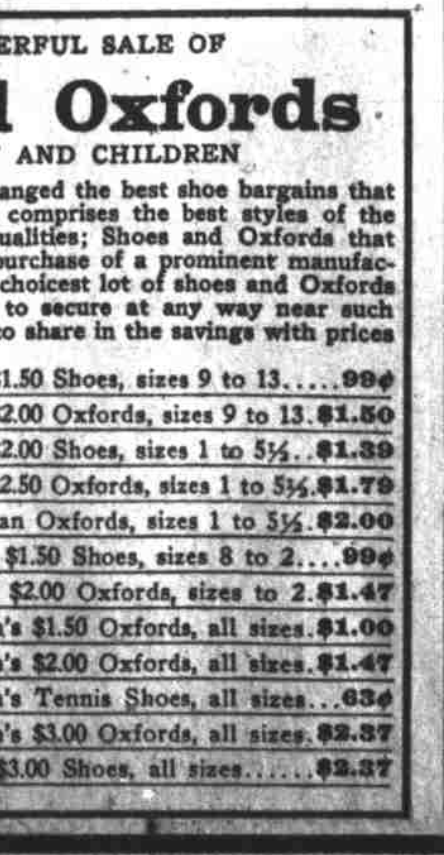
