MONEY SHRINKAGE STRIKES ENGLAND

Much Greater Fluctuation Than That America Experienced.

By John E. Lathrop. (Washington Bureau of the Journal.) Washington, June 6.—England's fluctuation of the volume of circulating medium is 80 per cent from the low to the high points in a given year.

The United States' fluctuation of the volume of currency is practically nothing. While the fluctuation in only one country is three days in France, five days in Germany, seven days in Canada, 18 days in the average life of a bank note in this country is two years, 27 days.

These facts designate the test to be applied where to judge the efficiency of the currency systems of the several countries; the fundamental difference between the law governing the issue of currency in those countries and this is that there the individual may go to the bank of issue and get his emergency currency without the intervention of any bank.

Under the law of this country which was effective until the Aldrich-Vreeland bills were introduced, the central reserve banks controlled absolutely the volume of the currency; and therefore controlled the rate for call loans, which corresponds to the bank discount rate in England.

Senator Aldrich of Rhode Island has been elected chairman of the currency commission. He is a senator popularly known as the "father of the bill."

BIG GOLD STRIKE IN NEW MEXICO

Mining Camp of Goldfield Near Old Lead to Rival Namesake.

(Special Dispatch to the Journal.) Santa Fe, N. M., June 6.—A mining camp which bids fair to rival either those of Goldfield or Rawhide, Nevada, and which has been named Goldfield, has sprung up in southwestern New Mexico, in the county of Grant, where one of the richest gold strikes in the history of the southwest was recently made.

The miners of the new district held a meeting this week and named the new camp Goldfield, and they have applied to the postoffice department at Washington for a postoffice under that name.

Half a dozen stores have also been started in the new camp, a hotel has been opened, and half a dozen saloons, miners' shacks and hundreds of tents cover the townsite, which has been plotted, and real estate men and speculators are reaping a rich harvest.

A mile north of the former is a quartz vein running along with a phonolite dyke on which Henry Wood, a veteran miner, has what he calls the Buckhorn group of claims. He has been running a tunnel in this vein, and the other day the vein was struck to a good width.

The new camp of Goldfield of the Hachita mountains shows better than other Goldfield or Rawhide, Nevada, did at the same stage of development. It now numbers almost 3,000 inhabitants, where two months ago there were but half a dozen prospectors, and miners are flocking into the camp by the hundreds daily.

DAMAGE SUIT IN FEDERAL COURT

(Special Dispatch to the Journal.) Astoria, Or., June 6.—A suit has been filed in the United States court by Mrs. Annie Anderson of Portland against the city of Astoria to recover \$20,000 damages for personal injuries received in this city during the regatta of 1907 by slipping on the apron of the railroad track that led to Piles.

As Mrs. Anderson is of foreign birth and has never been naturalized, the suit was brought in the United States court. She has retained J. H. and A. M. Smith of Astoria and Judge McGinn of Portland as her attorneys.
