

NO CONTROVERSY STILL NOT SETTLED

County Court May Yet Control Prisoners at Kelly Butte.

Sheriff Stevens may yet have to bump the bump in spite of the fact that he has won his contention by the referendum route, which gives him charge of the county prisoners, as against the argument of the county court that it should have charge of the prisoners and their feeding. The old feud, which came so near throwing a jolt into the Multnomah G. O. P., is not healed by any means, and according to County Commissioner W. L. Lightner, there will come a way by which the sheriff will be hedged about with the walls of his bastille, while Kelly Butte, full of prisoners wielding the heavy rock hammer, will still be in the hands and under the direction of the county court. To help out this plan George W. Emerson, district attorney, Mayor Lane and Chief Gritzmacher, will all lend their aid, according to the way Commissioner Lightner sees it.

While telling how the sheriff is to be circumvented, Commissioner Lightner had the following to say: "If the sheriff thinks he is soon to have a nice, fat monthly income from feeding a big lot of prisoners, he is destined to a rude and painful awakening. You see, the city jail is now overrun with prisoners, and the municipal authorities will welcome any plan that promises to relieve the situation. The county court is anxious to keep Kelly Butte running, but it must have control of the prisoners at work there. So in order to do this, Judge Cameron, the new district attorney, who is in sympathy with the court's contention, will have a large number of cases that were formerly tried in the circuit court, transferred to the municipal court, which will have the effect of largely increasing the number of prisoners in the city jail with a corresponding reduction in the number of inmates in the county jail.

"Then there will be a sufficient number of city prisoners with which to operate Kelly Butte and with the cooperation of Mayor Lane and Chief Gritzmacher, the big rock-breaking plant at Kelly Butte can be kept running without the assistance of the sheriff's few county prisoners."

PUBLIC READS LESS AS MERCURY RISES

With the coming of spring the circulation of books and attendance at the library always falls off to a degree. The total circulation for the month from all departments was, however, 20,762; of this the Albina branch circulated 2,353 books, the East Side branch 2,613 and the Sellwood branch, 1,796.

The library offers extra privileges this year to its patrons in the way of vacation reading. An extra card is permissible which will allow its owner to draw 10 books at once to be retained until October 1, if he sees fit without renewal. These books cannot be 1908 publications nor current periodicals, nor seven-day books nor travel books, but it is hoped that this privilege will be much appreciated by many who wish to do serious reading during the summer and who wish to take books with them to mountain or seashore. The older fiction can be taken out upon these cards and mothers may find it convenient to take with them extra books from the children's room for the benefit of their children. These cards are in force now and can be asked for at the circulating desk.

Owing to the special interest in Milton this year, the contents of his birth, a shelf has been arranged of which are collected Milton's works, also biographies and literary criticisms. They are in demand, and when in circulation are kept on this shelf. Maxfield Parrish's effective illustrations of "L'Allegro" are posted on one of the bulletin boards.

Young people planning their college careers will be specially interested in the "Go to College" exhibit, which has just been put up on the landing. It includes pictures of some of the more important colleges in this state, and contains information from nearly every college in the United States. This college exhibit is supplemented in the circulating department by special college shelves.

WILLIAMS WANTED FOR FORGERY

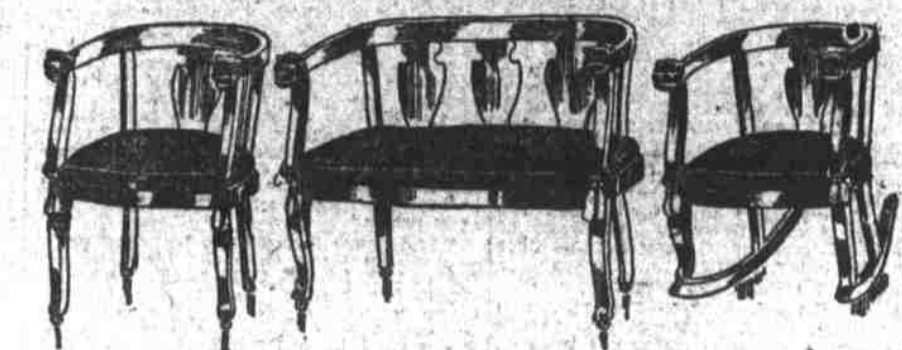

The complaint yesterday afternoon was sworn out by Charles Fessler, proprietor of the Hub. He says he has known Williams for a period of two years and thought he was honest.



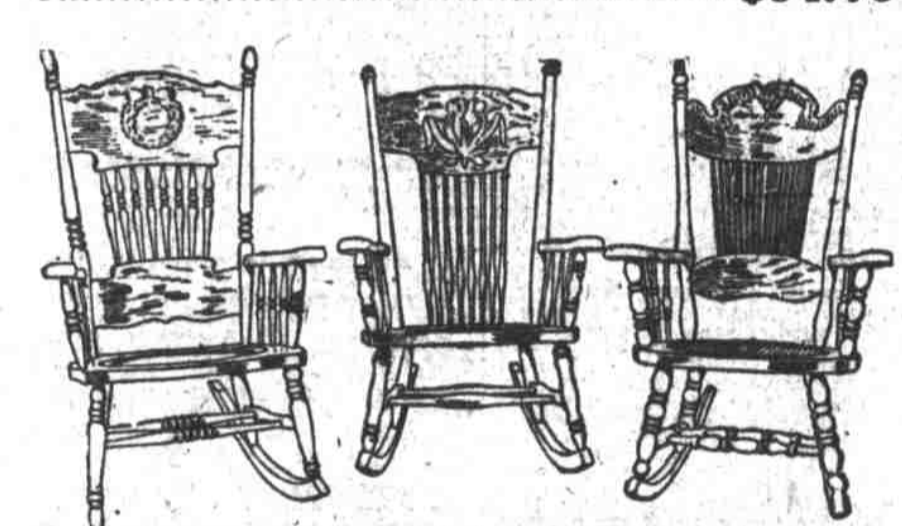

This Three-Piece Parlor Suite Reduced to \$34.75

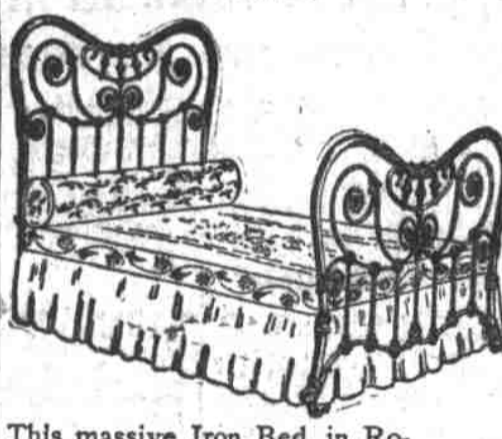

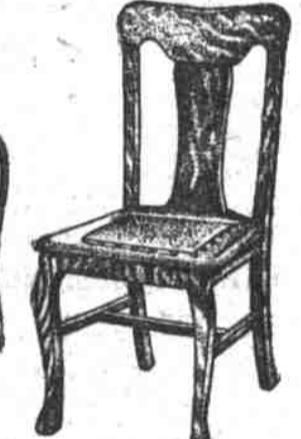

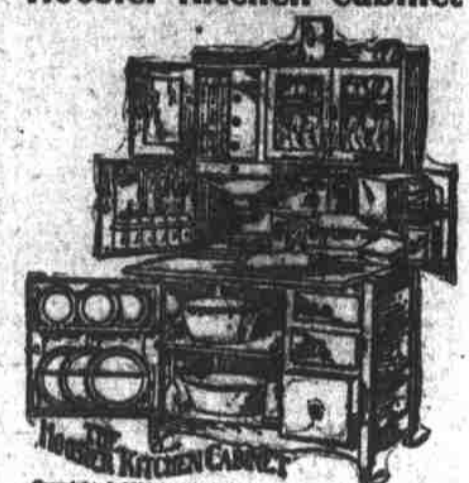
