

KLAMATH CASE IS HEARD HERE

By Special Agreement Warren Valley Hearing Takes Place in Portland.

The circuit court of Klamath county presided over by Judge H. L. Benson of the first judicial district, which is comprised of Klamath and Lake counties, is in session in Judge Webster's courtroom this afternoon. Argument is being heard in the case of the state vs. the Warren Valley Stock company. This is an unusual procedure and is a result of an express stipulation or agreement between the parties and not on account of change in venue or any ordinary case.

The case against the Warren Valley company was brought by Attorney-General Crawford sometime ago and originally involved 20,000 acres of state lands. While the title to these lands was vested in the state by virtue of the swamp land laws of 1850 and 1860 the state sold large quantities in lots of 900 acres and upwards. On demurrer Judge Benson held that the state was barred from contesting any but the last acre granted in 1893, covering 5,228 acres on account of the statute of limitations. The argument in Multnomah county tomorrow will be on the original issue between the company and the state, that is whether the authority vested under the law had the authority to deed more than 320 acres in any one grant.

er to begin operations. The Southern Pacific railroad extension from Weed is now under construction with 2,000 men, and will be completed to Klamath lake by September 1.

A Klamath Falls delegation, including W. A. Datzell, George T. Baldwin, Alexander Martin, E. H. Hall, E. R. Reames, C. H. Withrow, Earl Whitlock,

H. P. Galarneau, L. F. Willis, C. T. Oliver, R. S. Brigham, and G. Heitken- per Jr., is in Portland to make a study of promotion and publicity methods in the interest of the Klamath Falls chamber of commerce. They are interviewing Tom Richardson, manager of the Portland Commercial club, E. C. Giltner of the chamber of commerce and Fred Muller, secretary of the board of trade, on ways and means of furthering

the interests of a city through the agency of commercial organizations. A contract for the large south canal of the Klamath irrigation project has been let to Maney Bros., an electric light and power plant is being installed by Moore Bros. in the Link river, and will give service to Klamath Falls, Merrill, Bonanza, and other points in the irrigation district. The livestock industry has received strong impetus by

the outlook for railroad transportation. It is believed at Klamath Falls that the Southern Pacific company will push construction of the California & North-eastern on through Klamath Falls to a junction with the Oregon eastern and over the Cascade mountains at Odell lake, to a connection with the present Southern Pacific line at Natron, giving a direct railroad route between Portland and Klamath county.
