DEAD MAN'S NAME EDWARD BUSCHER

COMPARISONS IN CLATSOP'S VOTE.

Astoria, Or., June 10.—The vote cast at the recent general election in Clatsop county was 266 less than the registration held on the 11th day of May 1901 in the county, total of 3,057. The vote in 1894 in the city was 1,834 and in the county 898, a total of 2,732.

Accidental Shot Is Fatal.

Boise, Idaho, June 10.—Elmer H. Carson, formerly a resident of this city, who had for about a year been living on his ranch near Nampa, accidentally shot and killed himself near his home Sunday while hunting rabbits. The bullet entered his chest by the side of his neck and struck the heart.

Hotel at Tumwater Burned.

Olympia, Wash., June 10.—The Eagle hotel, for 20 years a landmark in the village of Tumwater, burned down yesterday. It was occupied principally by employees of the Olympia Brewery company, all of whom escaped, although a few lost their personal effects. Leo Schmidt, son of the owner of the brewery, was overcome by smoke while fighting fire and was taken to the hospital. His injuries proved not serious. The hotel was worth \$4,000 and carried \$1,200 insurance. It was owned by Oscar Miller.

Engineer Tee's Narrow Escape.

Astoria, Or., June 10.—City Surveyor A. E. Tee, while inspecting some grading work on the beach yesterday afternoon, was struck by a hauling cable and thrown several feet into the air. He sustained some severe bruises, but fortunately was not seriously hurt.

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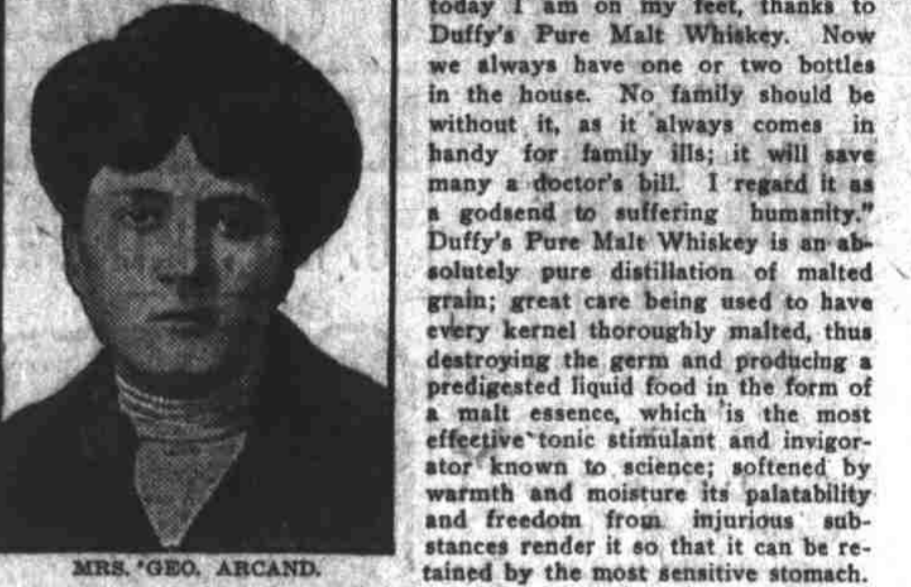
