

# HITCHCOCK NOT GUILTY OF CHARGE

## Jury Releases Actor After Considering Evidence for Seven Hours.

(United Press Special Wire.)  
New York, June 13.—The trial of Raymond Hitchcock, the comedian, charged with attempted assault upon young girls, was concluded late Wednesday in the supreme court, the case being given to the jury at 7:30 p. m., and returned a verdict of not guilty at 2:50 a. m. today.  
Shortly after midnight the jury entered the courtroom and asked for instructions as to the nature of reasonable doubt, the exact meaning of "inference" and whether, if the evidence was equally divided, the benefit of the doubt should be given to the defendant. The court explained the first two points and as to the last he said the defendant might be given the benefit of the doubt in case the evidence was equally divided.  
The jury returned to the courtroom about 2:40 o'clock and asked to have read the testimony regarding the presence of a curtain behind which Hitchcock's victim was said to have hidden in the forty-five minutes before the Von Hagen and Elsie Boecks testified that there was no such curtain, but a maid in the house said these girls were in the room at the time.  
The jury retired after the reading and in a few minutes reached the verdict of not guilty.

# RICH WOMAN MISSING; INSANE, SAYS HUSBAND

## Note Saying She Will Earn Her Own Living Conclusive Proof to Him.

New York, June 13.—E. Barton Hall Jr., son of the multi-millionaire, today hired private detectives to search for his wife, who disappeared from the Hall country home at Glencoe, L. I., and who, he believes, has gone insane. Mr. Hall declares that he would give everything he had to find his wife.  
Mr. Hall said that he feared she might have withdrawn a large amount of money from her own bank account in Manhattan, and that, in consequence, she might have met foul play while wandering about the city.  
The note which she received from her husband three days after she disappeared seemed conclusive proof to him that his wife was mentally deranged. This is the note:  
"Don't worry. I am all right. Will be home in a month. Get a job. Take a position. Want to earn some money, earning my own living."  
Mr. Hall pointed out that it would be absurd to think his wife would receive any such intention if she were in her right mind.

# EXPERTS TO WATCH HOT MONTHS' BABIES

## Will Call on Parents and Show Them How to Prevent Infant Mortality.

New York, June 13.—In an effort to keep down the rate of infant mortality during the hot months, the bureau of health today decided to inaugurate a system in general practice.  
This system was outlined at a meeting of officers of the health department with representatives from various civic organizations. One of the results of the meeting was the formation of the Society for the Care of Babies in Hot Weather.  
This society will cooperate with the health department. The department will keep a close record of every birth. Immediately upon receiving information of the event, a representative of the department or of the society will be sent to the augmented home to leave the card, and to make certain that the parents of the child know how little ones should be nourished and cared for in warm weather.

# \$11,000 GIFT TO MAYOR WHO QUITS PENNILESS

## Retiring St. Paul Executive Impoverished Himself to Pay Creditors.

St. Paul, June 13.—A few minutes after Robert A. Smith had retired from the office of the mayor of St. Paul he was handed an envelope containing a draft for \$11,000.  
This amount had been contributed by 87 business men of St. Paul as an appreciation to the venerable mayor's services to the city.  
Mr. Smith is 81 years old and has an office-holding record of 50 years in this county, 15 years of which, with the exception of one term, being spent in the mayor's office.  
At one time he was wealthy, but a bank in which he was an officer, failed and he sold his property to pay off the creditors. Today's gift prevents him from retiring penniless.
