

ADAIR CLEARED OF SUSPICION

Man Arrested in Connection With Morrison Murder Released From Jail.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Bellingham, Wash., June 16.—J. Adair, the suspect arrested at White Rock by the provincial police on the charge of being the man who committed the Morrison murder, proved himself innocent last night and was released.

As soon as Adair was captured, the little Morrison girl was summoned, but she positively stated that Adair is not the man. The timekeeper at the White Rock mill stated that Adair worked at the mill all the afternoon on which the murder was committed.

Four more suspects are now in the Bellingham jail and will be kept there until they can give a full account of themselves. Several deputies have been sworn in by both the Canadian and American authorities and the search for the murderer has not abated in the least.

The farmers in the vicinity where the murder took place have been scouring the woods day and night without success. The last clue that has been picked up was the finding of a bundle of old clothes near Hazelton.

INDIANAPOLIS READY FOR MUSIC FESTIVAL

Indianapolis, Ind., June 16.—Indianapolis is in holiday attire for the thirty-second annual national music festival of the Norm American Saengerbund, which convenes tomorrow evening. Every train today brought a quota of delegates and visitors, and indications point to an enormous attendance.

The decorations of the convention hall at the fair grounds, where the meetings and concerts will be held, have been artistically done, and the great building presents a beautiful and attractive appearance. The German houses, the hotels and other buildings in the city have also done gala attire.

The national colors of Germany and the United States are blended harmoniously in all the decorations. Great streamers of red, white, black and blue, with the flags of the two countries, are used in profusion. Another feature of the decorations consists of portraits of Bach, Beethoven, Mendelssohn, Wagner, Schubert and Mendelssohn.

The saengerfest will be in session three days. During that time there will be five concerts in which thousands of vocalists, representing over 15 German singing societies throughout the country, will participate. Besides these participants there will be the New York symphony orchestra, with 10 men, under Walter Damrosch, conductor, and Mrs. Schumann-Lietke, David Bispham and other noted soloists.

NATIONAL LUMBERMEN READY FOR SESSION

Minneapolis, Minn., June 16.—The convention of the National Lumber Manufacturers' association, which began at the Plaza hotel in this city today, has attracted one of the largest and most important gatherings of lumbermen ever held in America. Officially represented at the convention are a dozen separate and distinct organizations, among them being the Wisconsin Hardwood Lumber association, Western Pine Manufacturers' association, Northwestern Hemlock Manufacturers' association, Montana, Larch and Pine Manufacturers' association, Pacific Coast Lumber Manufacturers' association, North Carolina Pine association, Northern Pine Manufacturers' association, Georgia-Florida Sawmill association, Southwestern Washington Lumber Manufacturers' association and the Hardwood Manufacturers' Association of the United States.

The convention will be followed later in the week by an important conference between the wholesale and retail lumber dealers to consider relations between the two classes, and if possible to adopt a code of ethics to be adopted by the various associations of lumbermen.

SLAYER OF WARDEN HANGS IN MONTANA

Deer Lodge, Mont., June 16.—George Rock was hanged in the penitentiary here yesterday afternoon for the murder of Deputy Warden John A. Robinson during an attempt at an escape, last March. Rock had been serving a life sentence for murder and had been in six years. With William Hayes and two other convicts he made a desperate attempt to escape in the course of which the conspirators killed Robinson and dangerously wounded Warden Conley with knives. Rock refused to be tried, pleaded guilty and asked the court to sentence him to hang as quickly as possible. Last week he asked the prison officials if they could not hang him immediately. He said he took full responsibility for all his deeds of violence. He was granted a reprieve and was not accountable for his deeds. He was pronounced dead in 14 minutes after the drop.

SOCIETY LEADERS ARE ACCUSED OF PLOTTING

New York, June 16.—In his application to the federal courts to secure a reconsideration of his case, Lawyer Albert T. Patrick, now serving a life sentence for the murder of M. Rice, accuses persons high in social and political life of conspiring against him. William L. McDonald, a prominent Patrick in the University of Texas, acting as his counsel, and he made public Patrick's petition, which he prepared in prison.

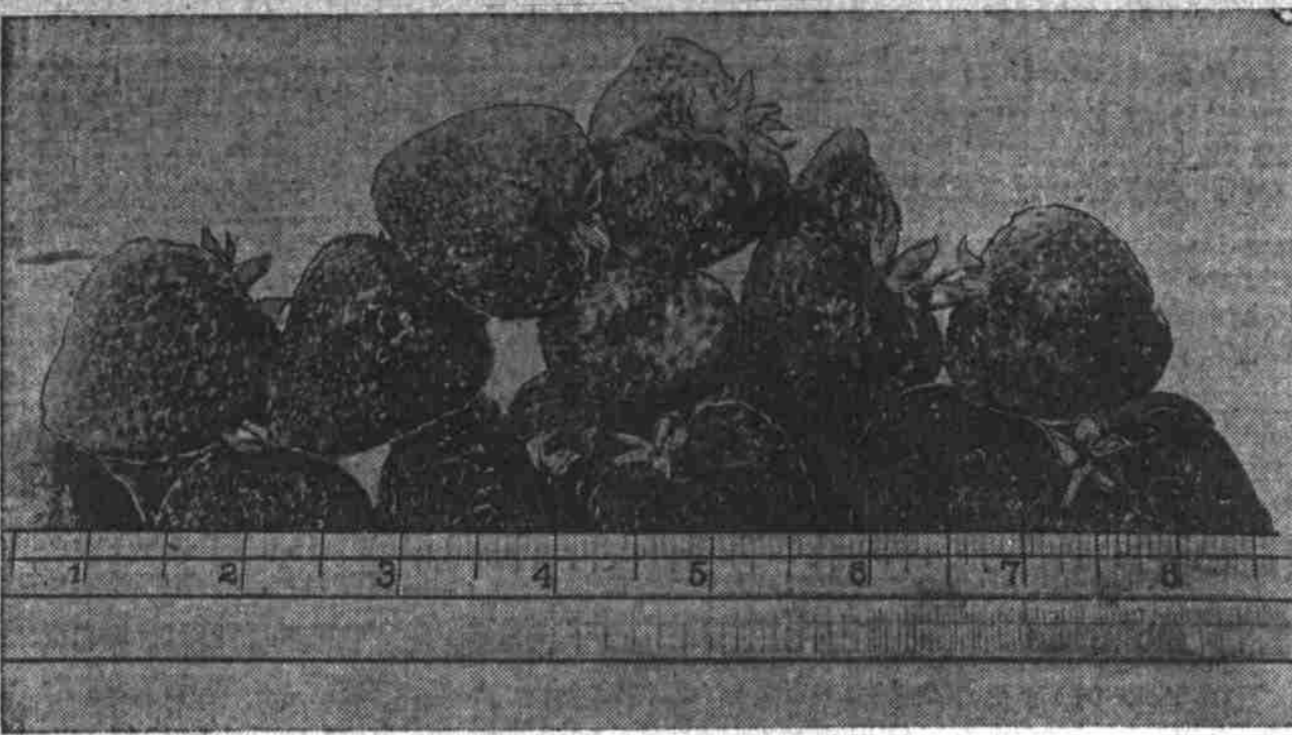
MARSHAL AND DISTRICT ATTORNEY FOR IDAHO

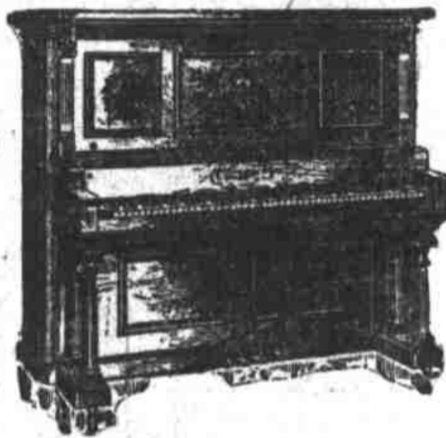
ERIE TIMBER MILL THREATENED BY FIRE
