Attendance This Year Was Largely in Excess of 1907—Registration 22,213.

The average daily attendance of children at Portland schools for the year just closed exceeded the attendance of last year by more than 1,000. The total registration this year was 22,213, of which 11,116 were girls and 11,097 were boys.
