## YEAR'S HARVEST, 48,500,000 BUS.

### Wheat Crop of Three States Will Fall Short of 1907 High Record.

**NORTHWEST WHEAT CROPS.**  
Oregon, 1908, 15,500,000 bushels; 1907, 16,500,000; 1906, 14,215,597. Washington, 1908, 20,000,000; 1907, 21,000,000; 1906, 25,074,284. Idaho, 1908, 7,000,000; 1907, 8,500,000; 1906, 8,221,000. Total, 1908, estimated, 42,500,000 bushels; 1907, 55,000,000; 1906, 47,510,881.  
Increase—Oregon, 1908, 725,000; 1907, 451,000. Washington, 1908, 1,410,000; 1907, 1,347,000. Idaho, 1908, 274,000; 1907, 242,000. Total, 1908, 1,449,000; 1907, 2,340,000.  
Within a very short time the 1908 wheat harvest in the three Pacific northwest states will start. Precipitous indications are for a crop of 48,500,000 bushels in the three states, divided as follows: Oregon, 12,500,000 bushels; Idaho, 7,000,000 bushels; Washington, 29,000,000 bushels. This will compare with a total of 50,000,000 bushels for 1907, and 47,510,885 bushels for 1906.  
This year's wheat crop promises to be larger than that of two years ago although the record-breaking production of a year ago with its extraordinarily favorable weather conditions will not be reached by at least 4,000,000 bushels.  
**Bad Weather Checks Crops.**  
The production shows a decrease, not because of any decrease in acreage for the three states show an actual increase this year of about 200,000 acres over 1907. Weather conditions were erratic from the time the first seeding for the 1908 crop started until the present time. This year's climatic conditions have gone entirely by contrast—the weather being cold and raw when it should have been mild. When the time came for cool weather the hot spell made its appearance and in this way climatic conditions staggered during the entire season.  
Perhaps one of the chief defects during the growing season was the cold, raw and chilly weather during the late spring months—a condition seemingly foreign to the Pacific northwest except on occasions so many years apart that the oldest inhabitant forgets all about it.  
When the time came for the spring-sown plant to make its real start for met with so chilly a reception that for a long time it made no progress whatever. This year the three states have an acreage of 2,545,000 compared with 1,340,000 during the previous year.  
This year Oregon had 725,000 acres sown mostly to winter wheat while the larger portion of Washington's 1,447,000 and Idaho's 274,000 acres were of the spring variety. Spring wheat was principally affected because of the smallness of the rainfall during the winter and spring months. This shortage is the most pronounced in years.  
**Walla Walla Affected.**  
Principal among the sections affected by the lack of moisture is Eureka Flat

country where the bulk of the Walla Walla crop is grown. This is entirely a light-land district and whenever rains are short this section is one of the first to suffer. A year ago with ideal climatic conditions everywhere, the Eureka Flat country produced the Pacific coast's biggest crop; more bushels to the acre and more acreage to the district than any other section. Taking two year's crops in succession, however, the Eureka Flat country has no reason to blush.  
Along the light-land sections of eastern Oregon and along the Columbia river, the same condition exists and the crops are not so heavy as previously expected. One of the redeeming features of the Columbia river section in 1907, is the fact that much the larger per cent of the seeding is done in the fall and winter. In the vicinity of Pandleton climatic conditions were so good during the wintry season that seeding was carried on in some places ever after the turn of the year.

## WOMAN'S CLUBS TO MEET AT CHAUTAUQUA

The Chautauqua recognizes the great work and high aim of the Woman's clubs. It solicits the support of all women who work for the betterment of mankind and wishes to add them in their great task.  
The coming of Miss Anna Lewis Clark, chairman of the civil service committee of the General Federation of Women's clubs of America, as one of the Chautauqua lecturers will be of absorbing interest to all clubwomen.  
Miss Clark will give one lecture on the main platform on July 14, which is W. C. A. U. day, on "Practical Patriotism."  
The Oregon Federation of Women's

clubs, led by Miss Clark, will conduct a club institute extending throughout the season. This will be held from 10 to 11 a. m. at the O. F. W. C. headquarters, which will be in charge of Mrs. Sarah A. Evans, president of the Federated clubs, and Mrs. M. A. Dalton, secretary of the Chautauqua committee.  
The federation committee for Chautauqua will select camping ground and assist clubwomen in getting comfortably settled. A limited number of clubwomen may secure accommodations over night by applying in time to the chairman of the committee, Mrs. M. A. Dalton, 300 Pettygrove street, Portland. The Minthorn Flower club will have charge of the decorations.  
Clubs are urged to have individual headquarters.
