Former State Superintendent Placed in Charge of Country Club Exhibit.

George Gamble, who for many years has been superintendent of livestock exhibits at the Oregon state fairs at Salem, has been selected for the same position by the Portland Country Club and Livestock association.

He will be in charge of the four important divisions during the exposition held for which the club received every day. The classes are as follows:

Division A—Horses. Class 1—Standard bred and Morgan horses. These include stallions of 2, 3 and 4 years of age; mares of 1, 2 and 3 years of age, with 4-year-olds accompanied by a foal or in foal.

Class 2—American, English, German and French breeds, with their own classification as in class 1. Sweepstakes medals for the best stallion and mare, any age, are included in these classes.

Class 3—Imported and American pure bred Percheron and French draft horses. Sweepstakes medals for the best stallion and mare, any age, are included in these classes.

Class 4—Imported and American pure bred Clydesdale and Englishshire, usual classifications. Class 5—Any draft breeds other than the preceding.

Class 6—Jacks and Jennets. Class 7—Special cup classes. Division 8—This will include all classes of beef and dairy cattle, bulls, cows, champions, heifers, groups, etc.

Division C—Special prizes and increased prizes will be offered in the department which embraces Poland Chinas, Berkshires, Duroc Jerseys. Any other breeds, with sweepstakes medals.

Division D—In the sheep division there will be special prizes and increased prizes offered above all awarded at any previous shows held in the northwest. Classes include horned and polled breeds, long-wool, medium breeds, Merinoes, Angora goats, with sweepstakes in each individual class.

The country club and Livestock association is receiving entries in all these divisions and classes and is arranging for the premium list, announcements and other work to be made within the next two weeks.

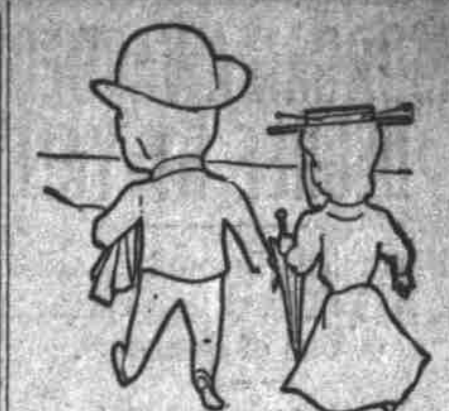
