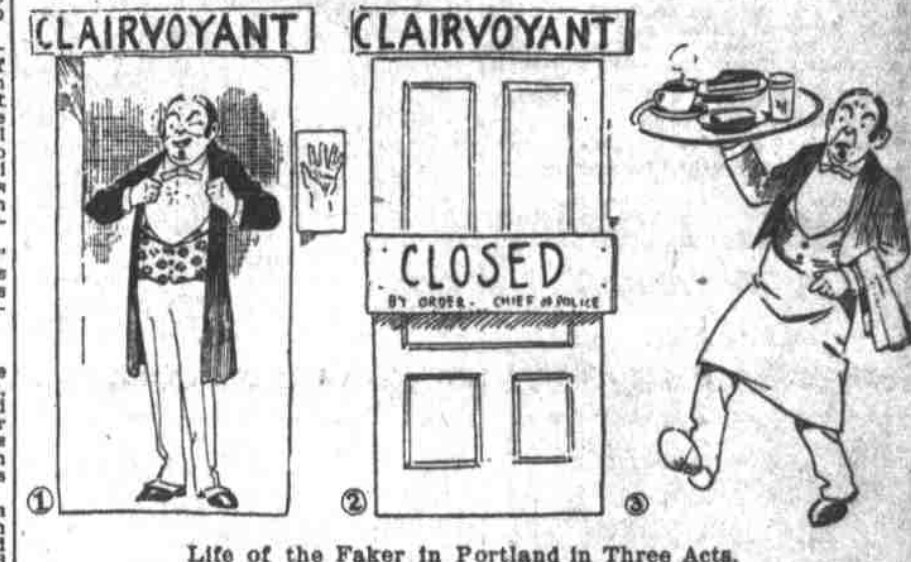

Deal Reported by Which Clackamas Man Is to Be Put in Saddle. (Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Newport, Or., June 26.—A succession of heavy showers last night and this morning has drenched Newport and considerably dampened the enthusiasm of the delegates to the Grand Army encampment.

James U. Campbell of Clackamas county wants the Multnomah delegation in his fight for the speakership of the next house. A. W. Orton, who has been heralded as a leading candidate for that honor and who claims to have seven out of the 13 members of the delegation under his banner, is now said to be willing to forego his ambition and deliver the delegates to his Orton rival, Campbell.

Orton supporters contend that their champion, who is also the same time pledged to Statement No. 1, under the belief that both can land the plums. Campbell is working to gather the delegates together for consideration of the organization question, but most of the delegation think it is far too soon or chancy to make the same time the organization. It is not believed that the delegation will formally organize until late in the summer, perhaps not until October.
