BREAK OPEN SAFE, STEAL SARDINES

Tramps Rob Scappoose Store—Walk Out of Town Eating Crackers.

The general merchandise store of G. B. Milloy, in Scappoose, was broken into and robbed early this morning, presumably by tramps. The safe was

opened by the aid of section-house tools, which the robbers had confiscated from the section-house. Just a year ago Mr. Milloy's store was robbed, the safe cracked and several hundred dollars' worth of goods taken. Mr. Milloy and his wife came to Portland this morning on the early train. Just before boarding the cars the discovery was made that the store had been burglarized. The men entered by breaking down the front door. The robbers did not take the books nor the papers. After breaking open the safe they had a good time about the store for a while. Naturally, they were hungry. Naturally, they ate. Several dozen boxes of sardines are missing. Also a brick of cheese and enough soda crackers to feed a picnic for a week. On this account—because the food was eaten on the ground—it is thought that tramps did the work. When the alarm of the robbery in

Scappoose was sounded this morning the whole town was soon up in arms. By means of a line of sardine cans and a few cracker crumbs now and then, it is believed the robbers, or tramps, left the city by way of the railroad track. That is, it is believed that they walked out of town. After carefully examining the safe the constable decided that tramps did the work. That the work was not that of professionals is evident because the crackers, that is the robbers, used section-house tools instead of dynamite or "sawp". So, as tramps can offer no defense, the Scappoose job of early this morning has been attributed to tramps—just the common, ordinary, everyday, road tramp of today and everywhere. SHORT CHANGE MEN WILL NOW CRACK ROCK

Clever Work by the Police Results in Capture of Two Swindlers.

Tracking the attorney engaged by one pal to aid the other who was in the toils, the police were able to apprehend both members of a pair of short-change artists. The man who stuck by his

partner received a sentence of 90 days in the county jail and a fine of \$200 in the municipal court today. Robert Fennell and Charles Aubrey tried the well-known dodge of returning to a store where they had made a purchase a few minutes before and asking to have \$5 in silver changed to gold. The store in question was that of Burroughs & Gault, Third and Clay streets, and its cash register had once been depleted by the swiftness trick. Fennell was seized and was soon in jail. Soon after Attorney Charles Petrain asked at the police station to see Fennell. Suspecting that Aubrey had retained him, Detectives Holley and Pat Maloney and Officer John Maloney tracked the lawyer when he left the jail. He met Aubrey and the second arrest followed. Despite an impassioned plea this morning by Petrain, Judge Cameron gave Fennell 90 days and \$100 fine and his faithful pal a sentence of 90 days and \$200 fine.

DATES ARRANGED FOR FORUM DAYS

An interesting feature of the Gladstone Centennial is the Chautauque forum, held daily, except Sundays. On W. C. T. U. day, July 8, after a reading by Mrs. R. C. Ganson of Oregon City, President H. M. Crooks of Albany college, will talk on "Morality and Literature." This will be followed by a reading by Mrs. Allen Brown of Jennings Lodge, July 9 and it will be given to health problems. Rev. Luther S. Dyott, D. D., Rev. William J. Elliott, Dr. J. B. Wetherbee and Dr. W. R. Williamson, all of Portland, will give short addresses. Portland Day, July 10, President P. S. Campbell will be in charge of the state university rally; on July 11, President W. H. Ferrin will lead Pacific University and on July 12 President J. J. Kerr will

lead the state agricultural college. Superintendent T. J. Gary will be in charge of Public School Day, July 13. Hon. J. H. Ackerman, superintendent of public instruction, and Hon. W. R. Robinson, superintendent of Multnomah county, will give addresses. The women's club have secured Professor Joseph Shaffer of Eugene, to tell what he found in London and Hon. E. T. Mielke will give "A Talk on Parks." On Pioneer Day, July 14, Colonel John McCracken, a pioneer of '49, will read from the "Merchant of Venice," and Judge T. J. Brown will tell of Thomas the Apostle of Alaska. A special program will be given on Patriotic Day, July 15. To Lay Cornerstone of Y. M. C. A. Erected in Idaho, June 15—Judge B. B. Detrick of the federal court for the district of Idaho will deliver the principal address at the cornerstone laying of Fayette's new \$1,200,000 building, which will take place Monday, July 5.
