Committee Finds Bad Wiring and Poor Protection in Vaudeville House.

Within five years all the theatres in Portland will have to be housed in brick buildings if the plans of Building Inspector Dobson are carried out.

At present the only brick theatres in the city are the Marquam and the Panjages, reconstructed houses. The Hellig seeks early completion and the others are all frame buildings.

The request was denied and was withdrawn but the committee was sent over to inspect the house. It reported yesterday that it had recommended several changes including alterations in the sprinkler system and the electric wiring.

The wiring was found to be in bad condition, according to the report, and there are long distances of loose flexible wire. These were ordered cut out and replaced by rigid wire.

At present there is no city ordinance protecting people from overcrowding in the theatres excepting that providing that everyone shall have a seat and a half of floor space.

KAKO GIVES UP

HUGE GENERATOR

Machine Will Be Rushed to Portland From New York by Special Train.

To accommodate the city of Portland and the Portland Railway, Light & Power company, the Japanese government has turned over a newly completed 2,500 kilowatt generator to the company for immediate use.

The essential thing now is a huge steel shaft upon which to mount the generator. The shaft is being forged at the Bethlehem Steel company's plant at Bethlehem, Pa.

The shaft will be made from a solid butt, and will be 18 inches in diameter and 21 feet long.

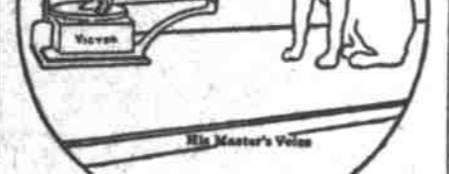

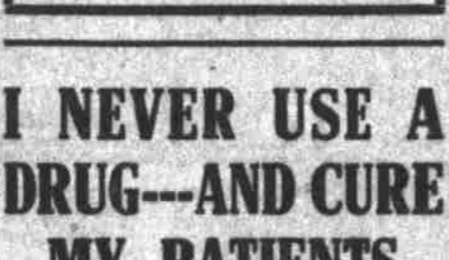

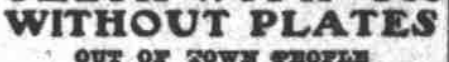
