President Whitmore has notified the managers that postponed games must be made up before the season closes, and that none will be allowed after that.

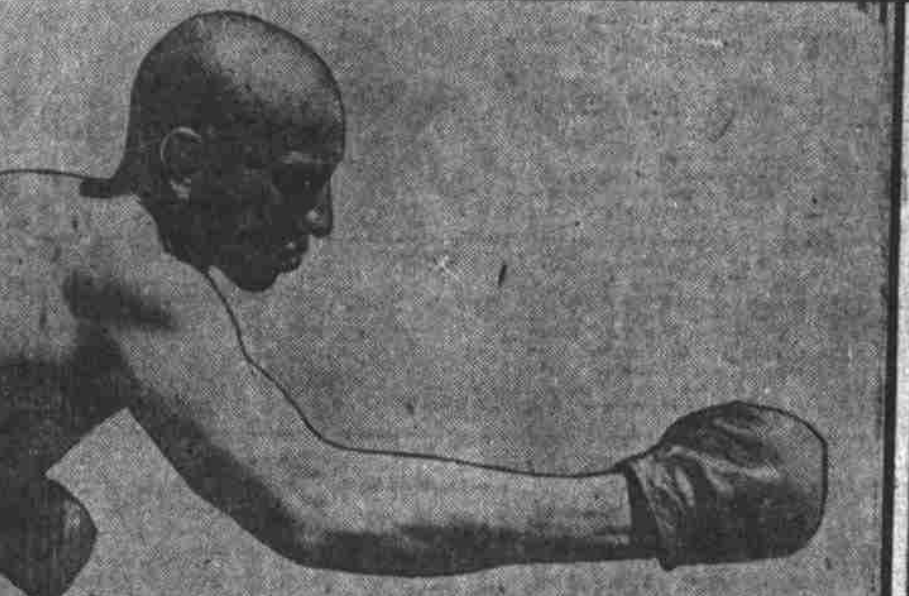
