Martin present to lead the chorus choir and extended to him the hearty good wishes and prayers of the members of the church and congregation.

Miss Helen Bushnell, a member of the choir, in a felicitous speech presented both Dr. Riley and Mr. Martin roses of Satsuma work. Dr. Riley and Mr. Martin responded, congratulating Dr. Brougher and his people upon the work they are doing. Dr. Riley will speak three times Sunday that being the closing day of the series of meetings which he is conducting in this city.

Sunday morning at 10:30 o'clock he will speak on "The Stray." At 3:30 o'clock to men only on "The Sixth Commandment," and at 7:45 on "A Man in the Modern Sodom." The appeal last evening was especially to family life and the subject taken from the entrance of Noah and his household into the ark. Dr. Riley maintained that God had made provision of salvation for the entire family and that by divine appointment the father and mother ought to precede their children in coming to Christ even as Noah and his wife went first into the ark.

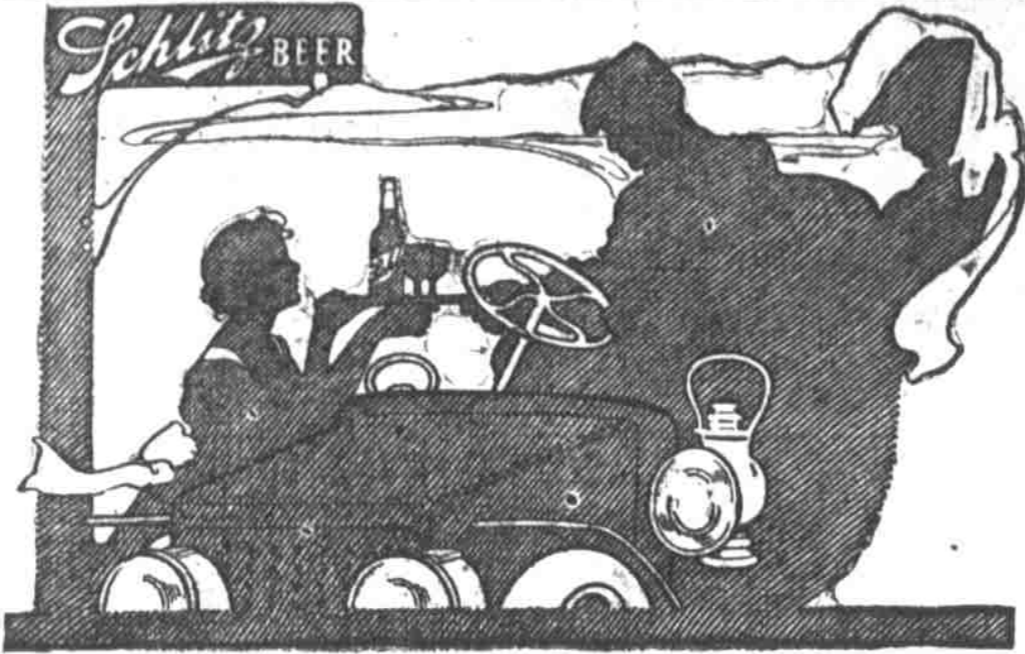

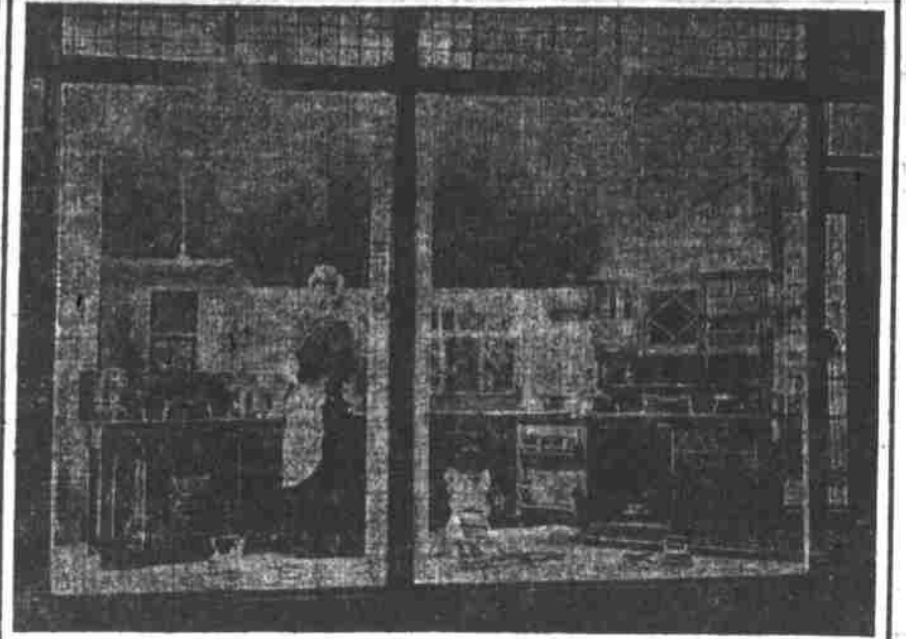
