

PORTLAND-SAN DIEGO AUTO ROAD

California to Spend \$30,000,000 on Highway—Oregon Should Follow Suit.

A GREAT public highway stretching from San Diego, Cal., to Portland, 60 feet wide, built of macadam. Enormous increase in the tourist travel to the coast, together with an annual expenditure by automobilists of from \$1,000,000 to \$2,000,000. Portland is to become the greatest convention city in the country. These are some of the things that J. L. Craig of Stockton, Cal., one of the California highway commission and formerly with the Portland Gas Company believes will result from the new roadway. Mr. Craig is going to spend \$30,000,000 to build from San Diego to Eureka. Mr. Craig believes that if the plan now being stated by Oregon good roads enthusiasts to have Portland connected with the California state line by an extension of the road is carried out that it will be the best thing possible for the coast states.

Los Angeles Hogs All. "We have been collecting statistics in California relative to the results received from good roads," said Mr. Craig, "and we find that every year in the American States in France spend \$240,000,000. Now this is just because France has good automobile roads and these people and many more of them would come to the Pacific coast, willingly if they could." "The Santa Fe and Southern Pacific roads say that they receive thousands of letters annually asking them for information about the roads of California and Oregon and as to the best place to have automobiles shipped to for country trips. The replies are all to Los Angeles at present as she has the best automobile roads in California, but if the road from San Diego to Portland were constructed it would send thousands of motorists along the coast from north to south."

California Progressive. "California will appropriate \$30,000,000 at the next election to construct the road as far north as Eureka. If Oregon joins in and agrees to build to the state line the California road will meet it and the roadway will be the finest in the country. We have found down in California that good roads cost more than flowers and climate in attracting people with money to spend, and we are trying to boost roads now instead of the old things." "Mr. Craig says that the reconstruction of the Canyon road to the county farm will prove a mighty good thing for Portland and is an important step in the right direction."

He is full of figures on California and the San Joaquin valley, and says that surprising as it may seem, the financial depression, instead of limiting homebuilders' trips to the coast, has increased them. "The desire seems to be spreading to own a small tract in the country instead of to gather in the cities. Mr. Craig left Portland about four years ago, went to the San Joaquin valley and secured several thousand acres of land along the Santa Fe railroad, selling it in acre tracts or larger. It has proven a big success."

Sets Example for Portland. He is an enthusiastic Stocktonite. Stockton, he says, recently raised \$500,000 in 40 days for a new tourist hotel. Then the Y. M. C. A. wanted \$30,000 for a new building, they got it in 48 hours, raised their share and got it in 30 days. They've just voted to spend \$150,000 on new asphaltum streets. That's the way the best things in Stockton, says Mr. Craig.

MADAME RIBBECKE RETURNS.

Glad to Get Back After a Long Absence From the City of Roses. Madame M. C. Holmes Ribbecke, one of the best-known dermatologists, is back again after an absence of some time, and says there is no place like home. Mme.
