### ILL FORTUNE HITS FLEET

#### Ten Cases of Scarlet Fever Discovered on Battleship Nebraska.

San Francisco, Cal., July 7.—The remarkable good fortune that has hovered over the men of the Atlantic battleship fleet was dispelled on the Nebraska when 10 cases of scarlet fever were discovered. The first case was discovered by Surgeon Morris W. Baker and Thomas Iveyhill, attached to that battleship, when an ordinary seaman went to them for treatment for sore throat, one of the first symptoms of the dread-

ed disease. The surgeons immediately diagnosed the case as scarlet fever, and as soon as the commanding officer of the Nebraska could be notified the patient was isolated in the hospital of the ship. Every precaution was taken to prevent a spread of the disease, but by yesterday afternoon, or less than 24 hours after the first appearance of the malady, 10 cases had developed. The afflicted men were removed to the hospital of the Nebraska, and Surgeon Baker went ashore to confer with Dr. Hobdy, in charge of the federal quarantine service at this port. It was arranged after a conference with Admiral Sperry and Captain Nicholson of the Nebraska that the battleship should remain pending for disinfection and fumigation at the Angel Island quarantine station. Every article of clothing possessed by the crew, every book and cranny of the big battleship will be fumigated and every man aboard will be compelled to look after his own effects before and after the fumigation of the ship. The bad luck of the Nebraska did not extend to the other 15 battleships, on all of which there was stir and bustle all day in preparation for today's departure.

### RADICAL PLANKS BY NEW YORKERS

#### Text of Demands on Anti-Injunction, Exclusion and Greater Navy.

(United Press Special Wire.) Denver, Col., July 7.—The exact text of the New York anti-injunction plank which the delegation from that state will demand be approved by the convention is as follows: "We insist most strongly that the courts must be maintained and upheld in every way within the province assigned to them by the constitution of our country. Neither the executive nor legislative branch of the government should be permitted in the slightest degree to invade or interfere with that part of the work of government assigned to the courts, but, because of the way in which some judges have acted in cases where contempt occurred, we pledge ourselves, as we have done in the past, to continue to fight the courts to the end that public confidence in the courts may be continued and strengthened. To the enactment of a law forbidding the issuance of injunctions in any cases in which an injunction would not issue if no labor disputes were involved and issued when there is an adequate remedy at law. Such enactments shall be the punishment of the contempt of court, not committed in the actual presence of the court, the party cited for contempt shall be entitled to a trial by jury." The New York exclusion plank is worded as follows: "We favor the continuation and strict enforcement of the Chinese exclusion law and its application to the same class of all Asian races." Regarding the greater navy New York says: "We hold that the constitutional provision that a navy shall be provided and maintained, means an adequate navy, and we believe that the interests of this country would be best

### GIRLS IN INDIA MARRIED AT FOUR

Mrs. Caroline Wallace Tells of Horror of Child Wives Across Water. Mrs. Caroline P. Wallace of the Indian American Woman's Restoration League addressed mass meetings Sunday and Monday afternoons at the Centenary M. E. and the First Congregational churches on "Child Marriage in India." "Children are sacrificed in that heathen land under the sacred rites of marriage," she said. "True childhood is unknown in India. The girls are married before the age of 12, and if they wait longer the parents lose caste—a terrible disgrace in India." Statistics collected by the government were read showing the extent of this practice and letters from Hindus inter-castings, this barbaric practice. They read: "The organization exists for the purpose of arousing sentiment in India against this barbaric practice. We hope to fill India with branch organizations to work for a change, and in India they now have many strong friends and sympathizers. Their immediate effort at reform will be a request that the government raise the marriage age limit to 18 instead of 12. The league is interdenominational and requests the support of all. They send literature about the country telling of the condition of the child wives who are total wrecks from their marriages, some of which take place before they are 4 years old. Two local circles were formed with Mrs. R. E. Hoyt of 631 1/2 and Mrs. A. Olson of 48 North Thirtieth as presidents, and all are invited to join. Mrs. Carrie Tombar, California girl, accompanies Mrs. Wallace and gives all the meetings and otherwise lends her aid. She is to return with her to India.
