DOCK CHARGES REDUCED.

Port of Portland Makes Rates More Inviting to Ship Owners.

It will be chaper to have vessels drydocked in Portland acommission it was decided to make a general cut in the rates, except that the minimum was raised from \$30 to \$40.

The rate for steam tonnage was put on the following schedule: Under 1,000 tons, 24 cents; 1,000 to 2,000 tons, 21 cents; 2,000 to 4,060 tons, 18 cents; over 4,000 tons, 15 cents. Sall tonnage was placed at 19 cents for vessels under 600 tons; 17 cents for 1,000 tons, and 16 cents for more than 1,000 tons, and 16 to their respective offices. C. F. Adams, treasurer, was placed under \$50,000 bonds, th accordance with the recent ruling requiring bonds for all officers handling money.
