NORTH BANK MAIL RUN FROM PORTLAND ESCAPE FROM LOCAL SANATORIUM LOCATED

Postal Clerks on New Line Are to Be Under Chief Clerk Whitney.

The mail run on the Spokane, Portland & Seattle, also known as the North Bank road, is to come under the jurisdiction of Frank E. Whitney, chief clerk of the railway mail service with headquarters in Portland. Mail cars on the line now running between Vancouver, Wash., and Pasco, a distance of 221 miles, will be put on July 27, the contract with the government ending for service on that date.

A contract between the officials of the road and the department at Washington was announced exclusively in The Journal several days ago. Four clerks will be put on the run beginning July 27, all of whom will make their homes in Portland.

About the middle of August with the completion of the Willamette and Columbia river bridges North Bank trains will begin running directly into the Portland passenger station. As soon as night trains are put into effect postal clerks will be put on to accompany these trains.

For a time it was thought that the North Bank might be run out of the office of the chief clerk of the railway mail service at Seattle. Word that Mr. Whitney would have charge, however, was received in Portland yesterday.
