Battleship South Carolina Launched at Philadelphia—Is Christened by Miss Ansel, Daughter of South-ern Governor.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Philadelphia, Pa., July 11.—Into the waters of the Delaware river, on whose shores so many ships of the "new navy" have been built, there was launched today the great steel hull of what will be the formidable battleship South Carolina.

The launch of the South Carolina was entirely successful and was witnessed by a number of invited guests, including an official party from the Palmetto state and a number of distinguished naval officers from Washington, New York and other points.

Christened by Miss Ansel. Governor Ansel of South Carolina was one of the conspicuous figures on the christening stand. The ceremony of naming the big battleship was performed by the governor's daughter, Miss Fredericka Ansel.

KERN'S FRIENDS CLAIM INDIANA

Mayor Bookwalter, Republican Leader, Praises Candidate.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Indianapolis, Ind., July 11.—Mayor Bookwalter, the Republican local leader, will take a leading part in welcoming John W. Kern to his home city.

The local committees are planning an elaborate reception for Kern. He is expected to arrive early next week, but the day has not been fixed. There will be a parade and a big jollification meeting.

The hull will be protected on the water line by a complete belt of armor eight feet wide, having a thickness of 11 inches throughout the machinery spaces and 12 inches at the magazine spaces. For a height of eight feet above the main belt there will be the casemate armor, eight inches thick at the top to ten inches at the bottom.

VOTE ON BONDING FOR NEW SCHOOL

FRISCO WATER SUIT IN FEDERAL COURT

San Francisco, July 11.—The suit of the Spring Valley Water company to restrain the city from collecting the water rates set by the board of supervisors has been submitted to the United States circuit court for decision. The case has been before the court for two weeks. Attorney McCutcheon appeared for the water company today. It claimed that the company's property was worth \$2,971,000 and that the water rate should enable the company to collect interest on this valuation. City Attorney Long filed in briefs today and the court will probably render decision some time next week.
