## PHILIPPINE DISHES BOUGHT IN GERMANY

J. L. Brooke, a representative of a wholesale crockery firm in Portland, Me., passed through New York recently en route to the Philippines, where his concern does an immense business in the sale of dishes among the people of the islands. He remarked during a talk that previous to the Spanish-American war, not a single dish was exported from this country to the Philippines, the Filipinos buying nearly all their dishes from England and Germany.

"But this is not so now," he added. "Today we have practically the whole of the Philippine china and earthenware market in our hands, and, of course, our export of dishes is increasing as the islands increase in population and civilization."

"The dishes which are mostly in demand out there at present are of the unbreakable variety, such as one seen in the cheaper restaurants, hotels, and boarding houses here."

"Among the wealthy class of Filipinos the most expensive china is in brisk demand. They think nothing of paying several hundred dollars for a tea or dinner set."

Mr. Brooke added that the value of our crockery and glassware export to the Philippines in 1907 was close to a million dollars.

## For Soft Wood Floors.

From Suburban Life. A soft wood floor can be made just as attractive and as easily kept as a hard wood floor. I have used the following method with success on my floors. First the floor must be thoroughly cleaned, then planed smooth and the cracks filled. An excellent preparation for filling cracks is made as follows: Put some sawdust in a dish, and pour enough boiling water over it to cover it and let stand until it is almost pulpy, stirring occasionally. When the

sawdust has reached this stage, put it over a fire and boil until it is of about the same consistency as good paste. Strain off all moisture and add enough thin glue water to soften a little. Press this into the cracks between boards and let it harden.

The next step is to go over the surface of the floor with a good ready

prepared wood filler, which may be bought of any dealer in varnishes. When the filler has dried apply several coats of floor varnish. To keep such floors clean all that is needed is a daily brushing over with a broom over which there has been slipped a cheesecloth bag and an occasional wiping over with linseed oil.
